SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT AND FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Presented to members at the Annual General Meeting of the Club, held at Barter's Hall, Hurstville, on Tuesday, the 12th April, 1938.

- - -

GENTLEMEN:

It is with pleasure that I present the 17th Annual Report of your Club. The year just concluded has been a most important one and members of your Club competed with distinction in Australian and Empire Games Championships.

Our usually strong distance team did not repeat its successes of other years, but this was offset by brilliant performances during the track season. We regret the loss of the Glick Shield which we won for the first time last year, but we have the satisfaction of having won the Referee Shield emblematic of supremacy in the State Track Championships. History was made by the appearance for the first time in the St. George District of famous international Athletic stars at the Annual Track Carnival promoted by the Club. Our favourable financial position is largely due to the success of this meeting.

REVIEW OF DISTANCE SEASON

At the commencement of the distance season we expected to perform very creditably but owing to a series of misfortunes, which were mostly unavoidable the team did not perform up to usual high standards of previous years. For the first time in five years St. George lost the teams race of the State 10,000 metres Cross Country Championship, but we had the satisfaction of securing the individual winner in Ray Mettam who ran brilliantly to win from B. Doyle of South Sydney Club in 35m. 6s. Our team performed fairly well to secure third place in the Novice Cross Country Championship, while Jack Hayes ran very well to secure third place after being prominent throughout the race.

In the ten and fifteen miles State Championships the St. George men were not prominent as a team, the most outstanding athlete being Alleyn Gainsford who secured fifth place in the ten mile and third in the fifteen mile.

In gaining third place Jack Hayes ran a very fine race considering that it was his first year in distance athletics. With more experience in scratch running he would have most likely won this event, as later in the season he consistently defeated both men who finished in front of him in the Novice. Bob Young, by securing eighth place in 28m Os., recorded his best Novice performance.

After a brilliant sequence of fastest times in open competition, Ray Mettam ran a splendid race to win the 10,000 metres State Cross Country Championship from B. Doyle of South Sydney and D. Farnhill of Western Suburbs. This is only the second occasion that a St. George athlete has won the individual title of the Cross Country Championship, Charley Weeks being last winner in 1925. Harry Gibbons showed his best form of the season to secure sixth place.

Owing to the inclement weather conditions St. George were represented by a small team and were defeated for the first time for a number of years. We extend our congratulations to the Western Suburbs Club.

CLUB MEMBERSHIP

With 87 financial members we find this position of the Club quite satisfactory and equal to the best of past years.

REVIEW OF TRACK SEASON

The Club may look back upon the Track Season just completed with pride. The St. George team was among the leaders in the Dunn Shield and

Inter-Club contests and won the Referee Shield outright as the winners of the greatest number of State Championships.

Six of our men represented their State at the National Championship Meeting in Brisbane and their performances there ensured their selection to represent Australia in the Empire Games at which meeting they competed against the cream of the Empire's athletes with distinction. Jack Mumford was easily the outstanding athlete of the year and was awarded the Richard Coombes Memorial Medallion for the second successive year. He won the 100, 220 and 440 yards races at the Dunn Shield and State Championship Meeting, the Australian 440 yards championship and was placed 2nd in both the 100 and 220 at the Empire Games and 4th in the "quarter".

During the year one Australian record was established by a St. George man when Basil Dickinson set 24'6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " as the new broad jump standard. Three Queensland records and two Australian championship marks were also bettered while the club record list was altered in ten places.

INTER-CLUB COMPETITION: St. George won the final of this competition, but were narrowly beaten by University (the minor premiers) in a Grand Challenge final. We were able to field our strongest team of all time this season and won six matches in a row, but the absence of six key men at the Australian Championships in Brisbane cost us two matches and the minor premiership. No half-mile or two-mile runners turned out for the Club in the Challenge final and University's overwhelming margins in these events decided the match, although we more than held our own in those events in which we were represented.

This competition consists of 18 events each conducted in three divisions or 54 events in all. We scored in 20 of these events, only 10 of our men gaining places. In "A" division we secured 5 first and 4 second places; in "B" division 5 first and 3 second places whilst in "C" division only 1 second and 1 third were gained. Our chronic weakness in events such as the pole vault, hammer throw, walking and hurdles let us down in this competition, but our limited team performed wonderfully well to take second place against very strong competition.

Jack Mumford's "treble" was an outstanding performance and it is doubtful whether these championships have seen a more impressive exhibition.

Our performances in the broad jump and shot put are the best recorded since the inception of these championships and Mumford's time for 440 yards has been bettered on only two occasions. W. R. MacKenzie was manager of the N. S. W. team and was chosen to act as an Australian selector.

BRITISH EMPIRE GAMES: St. George officials as well as athletes took part in the Games. W. Ahern being chosen to act as a field judge, B. C. Button as announcer and A. Gainsford as referee of the Marathon Race. The most impressive and spectacular display of athletics ever presented in this country the British Empire Games of 1938 will certainly have a profound influence upon the future development of the sport in Australia and members of this club will not be slow to profit from the valuable lessons learned from our visitors. The entry was the largest and most talented ever seen at an Empiad and the struggle for places in every event was exceptionally keen. The performances of our representatives are as follows:

4TH ANNUAL ATHLETIC AND CYCLING CARNIVAL: The Club's Carnival continues to be the most ambitious and successful promotion of athletics in New South Wales. A crowd estimated at 10,000 witnessed this year's spectacle and a satisfactory profit enabled us to donate a substantial cheque to the St. George District Ambulance. The main attraction was the appearance of British athletes who had arrived a few days previously to prepare for the Empire Games. Holmes (England) and Alford (Wales) subsequent winners of Empire Championships, were among those who competed and gave delightful exhibitions of stylish and powerful running. The Carnival was capably organised and managed by Messrs. B. C. Button and A. Gainsford.

COUNTRY VISITS: Two visits were made to Maitland during the season and both proved to be most enjoyable. Most notable performances in the Northern Districts were B. W. Sheiles Javelin Throw of 192 feet 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. and A. Rlythe's mile in 4m25s. The Club won the George and Dragon Cup in an Inter-Club competition from seven teams drawn from Sydney and Newcastle districts.

RELATIONSHIP WITH KINDRED CLUBS: We are pleased to record that our relationship with other affiliated clubs continues to be pleasant and our support to the Association this term has been all that could be desired. I am sure the Secretary of the A. A. A. of N. S. W. appreciates the work of your Club's officials and the support to the various functions by Club members.

OBITUARY: It is sad to record the passing of one of our promising junior sprinters Jim Haydon, also Mr. W. Kelleher a supporter and father of one of our old Club members.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT: Your Club finances are in a very satisfactory condition due mainly to the success of the Xmas raffle and the Annual Track Carnival, our thanks to the organizers B. C. Button and A. Gainsford. Mr. A. K. Marsh our former treasurer was forced to resign in September last through pressure of business, and I would like to record the Club's thanks for his good work in our interest. Our new treasurer Mr. G. Rootham has done well in spite of difficulties and I am sure your Club finances will be well cared for if he continues in office.

CONCLUDING REMARKS:

The Club reached its highest point in track competition during the year under review and can look forward to further success. It is confidently expected that next season will see our present band of champions reinforced by several men who have shown distinct promise in their first season.

It is difficult to discriminate between the many young men of promise, but Lindwall, Benson, Evans, A. Gould, W. Tyrell, E. Brookes, and C. Crutchley are definitely championship material.

While we failed as a team during last distance season, we should see a marked improvement this coming year. Our Novice team should be one of our strongest for some years and most of our old brigade appearing again, we should see some well contested teams events this season.

I would like to comment on the work of your Club officials in helping the district Scouts and Church bodies to conduct their various Athletic Carnivals throughout the summer season, this work is appreciated by these associations and shows the right spirit in fostering the sport among the younger members of our community.

Our band of officials are equal to any in this State and we are proud of the work and time they spend in making our Club meetings so successful, men such as E. Pope, W. Townsend, A. Gainsford, C. Campbell, A. Shepherd, F. Gould, H. Guinness, A. Straney, W. R. MacKenzie, J. Critchley, W. W. Hunt and to a new member Mr. McAuliffe.

To those many people who have extended financial assistance to us throughout the year, Messrs. J. J. Walsh, E. J. Brooke, M. Shanney, W. Hasler, W. Button, J. T. Hinkley, W. Pearce, H. Bennett, A. Gainsford, G. Hasler, J. J. Hackett, W. Sleigh, W. Young Snr., J. Gibbons, A. Shepherd, J. McGrath, Ald. J. C. Ross, B. C. Button, W. Eisen and to those who I may have forgotten to mention, we offer our sincere thanks.

In conclusion I would like to extend my personal thanks to Messrs. A. Gainsford and W. R. MacKenzie for their assistance in compiling this report, to our former secretary B. C. Button for his generous help throughout the year, and to all the other Club officials and members for their co-operation.

So at the end of my first term as secretary I feel pleased to say I have done my best to continue on the good work of my predecessors, who built the foundation of this great club of ours. It has been hard at times, but I know my work has been appreciated and I always hope to be associated in some way with the St. George D. A. A. C. - a better band of young men would be hard to find.
