Nineteenth Annual Report & Financial Statement

Presented to members at the Annual General Meeting of the Club, held at the Kogarah School of Arts, on Thursday, 14th March 1940

Gentlemen:

The year just concluded has been one of the weakest in recent years, brought about by various reasons, mainly through the absence of outstanding athletes, the intervention of the War, and Technical night studies.

Although the Club experienced a slight decline in its progress, it was gratifying that we were able to secure 3rd place in the A Grade Interclub Competition with Botany and the Police clubs, this favourable performance was mainly due to splendid support given by the younger athletes of the Club.

The financial position of the Club continues to be satisfactory.

OBITUARY

Late Alderman S. Binder

With the demise of Alderman S. Binder your Club lost one of its most loyal supporters.

Alderman Binder was connected with your Club since 1922 and during his association with us he performed many favours in our interests which will always be remembered.

At the time of his passing, he was a Senior Vice-President and Honorary Auditor.

REVIEW OF THE DISTANCE SEASON: The Distance Season last year showed a further downward trend, but it is hoped this coming season there will be a much needed advance numerically and athletically.

Individually Ern. Evans ran particularly well to secure first place in the 5 Miles test race, 2nd place in the 10,000 metres cross country championship, and 3rd place in the 10 miles State Championship. Ern. Evans, by these splendid performances, was selected to represent N.S.W. in the Australian Cross Country Championship held at Hobart on the 12th August and in this event ran very well to secure 8th position.

This particular race showed the Club's weakness in younger division of cross-country running, with a promise of some of our young track men coming over this coming season we hope to do much better. We offer our congratulations to the winner and Botany Club on its team's win.

10,000 METRES C.C.C'SHIP (held at Botany, 29/7/39): 1st, H.Hergen-10 (Botany) 33m.44s.; 2nd, E.Evens (St.George) 33m.48s.; 3rd, J. Patterson (Botany) 33m.51s. Teams: Botany (36 pts) 1st; South Sydney (92) 2nd; Randwick-Kensington (99) 3rd; St. George (110) 4th.

The times recorded by the first three men show what a keen race this was, they fought out the issue practically from the start, and it was his sprinting ability that won the race for Hergenham; all three are to be congratulated for providing one of the most interesting races for some years.

10 MILES STATE C'SHIP (held Canterbury Racecourse, 26/8/39): 1st, J.Patterson (Botany) 56m.24s.; 2nd, B.Doyle (Sth. Sydney) 56m.27s. 3rd, E.Evans (St. George) 57m. 1s.; 4th, A.Gainsford (St. George) 57m.20s. Teams: Botany (37 pts) 1st; South Sydney (50) 2nd; Western Suburbs (89) 3rd.

From the half-way mark this race was a duel between the first three men, and the better staying power on the day of Patterson and Doyle enabled them to go away from Evans and finish 37 seconds in front - A. Gainsford ran a very game race with a leg injury to finish only 56 seconds behind the winner.

B. Doyle retained his title after a very fine run, and again our Club veteran, A. Gainsford, was hampered by a leg injury and did well to finish in 6th place in 1h.31m.29s.

Our only starter was E. Johnstone, who was in third position when
he retired at 14 miles. Our congratulations to Jim Patterson,
who finished a very strenuous season with this very convincing win.

5 MILES NOVICE C'SHIP (held Kensington Racecourse, 8/7/39): 1st, L.Williams, 28m.59s.; 2nd, F.Stark, 29m.41s.; 3rd E.Johnstone, 30m.29s. It was very pleasing to see Les. Williams win after being with us for a number of years.

10,000 METRES C'SHIP (held in conjunction with State C.C.C. at Botany, 29/7/39): 1st, E.Evans, 33m.48s.; 2nd, H.Gibbons, 35m. 35s.; 3rd, A.Gainsford, 36m.7s. This was one of Erm. Evans' best performances.

10 MILES C'SHIP: 1st, E. Evans, 57m.1s.; 2nd, A.Gainsford, 57m. 20s.; 3rd, J.Hayes, 58m.41s. This was the first occasion for a number of years that A.Gainsford has been beaten in this event, and the honours are with Ern. Evans.

5 MILES C'SHIP: 1st, J.Hayes, 28m.59s.; 2nd, A.Gainsford, 29m. 11s.; L.Williams (32m.20s.) 3rd. Jack Hayes showed a return to form and also won the sealed handicap in conjunction.

15 MILES C'SHIP: A.Gainsford (1h.31m.29s.) 1st. Our club veteren continues his unbeaten record in this event.

OPEN HANDICAPS: The opening of the 1939 Distance Sesson was held on your Club cross-country course at Ramsgate on 22nd April. Your Club was not very successful in competition in conjunction with this function. The 1,000 yards run-in resulted in a win for H.Hood (Botany), and the Teams' race was won by Botany with 22 points.

EASTERN SUBURBS' OPEN (held at Bondi, 6/5/39): Our first man to finish was F.Stark in 8th place (3.10) 16m.10s.; R.Duffin 11th (3.10) 16m.16s.

SOUTH SYDNEY OPEN (held Enmore, 20/5/39): L.Williams was our first man to finish - in 4th place in 18m.6s., followed by F.Stark in 13th place, 18m.48s.

ST. GEORGE OPEN (held Ramsgate, 3/4/39): Held over our cross-country course, it attracted a record entry of 121; of these, 102 started and athletes were well catered for, thanks to Mr. Pemberton, proprietor of Ramsgate Baths. The race was well conducted, due to the capable officials and was so well handicapped that it was found impossible to record the finishing places of each man

when athletes finished in bunches of tens and fifteens. The race was won by W.Futcher of Botany Club (2m30s) 22m.22s.; E.Mettam of St. George was 2nd, (2m50s) 22m.50s.; 3rd place to F.Rochford (3m50s) 23m.54s. Fastest time went to H.Hergenham 21m.10s., and E.Evans second with 21m.23s. The teams' race went to the Botany Club for the second year in succession with 34 points; Western Suburbs (72 points) 2nd.

Our congratulations to all winners and to the Hon. Handicappers, Mr. H. Parker of the Botany Club, W. Stoddart of South Sydney and our own club President, A.A.Gainsford.

RANDWICK-KENSINGTON OPEN (held Kensington Racecourse, 4 Miles, 17/6/39): F.Stark of St. George, in his first distance season, won this event with a handicap of 3m50s, his time being 23m.38s. Your Club was also successful when E.Evans took the honours of the race in recording fastest time of 21m.10s. for the distance.

WESTERN SUBURBS OPEN (held Canterbury Racecourse, 4 Miles, 1/7/39): The Western Suburbs race was a departure from the usual method of controlling these events when the field was divided in three sections, A Division (the fast men), B Division (the medium men) and C Division (the limit men). In the A Division, E Evans was 2nd to J.K.Stephens of Randwick-Kensington in 22m.59s.; in the B Division, A.Gainsford was the winner in 24m.30s.; while in the C Division, E.Johnstone was 2nd. In the handicap in conjunction, H.Gibbons of St. George was second with allowance of 1m.35s. — 21m.39s. The teams' events ... St. George was 3rd in both the scratch and handicap races.

ANNUAL CHALLENGE MATCH (held over State Cross-Country course Botany, 10,000 Metres, 24/6/39): Usually held against the Western Suburbs club, this year it was made a triangular contest, including Botany. The individual race was won by E. Evans of St. George by 24 seconds from W. Hamilton of Botany; our next man was J. Hayes in 7th place. The teams event was easy for Botany - they won by 89 points; St. George was second (173), and Western Suburbs 3rd (203). Congratulations to Botany and thanks to Western Suburbs for the good sportsmanship that it always displayed in races of this kind.

5 MILES TEST RACE (held Kensington Racecourse): This race assured E.Evans of selection in N.S.W. team when he won rather well. The results were: 1st, E.Evans (St.Geo.) 26m.31s.; 2nd, C.Hensley (Botany) 26m.35s.; 3rd, F.Flanagan (Botany) 26m.41s. Teams: Botany (1h.46m.57s.) 1st; St. George (1h.50m.18s.) 2nd; South Sydney (1h.54m.37s.) 3rd.

ST. GEORGE CLUB POINT SCORE: This resulted in a tie between A. Gainsford and J. Hayes with 63 points each. Both men ran consistently, but our veteran was unlucky when he missed one race, through

injury; this extra point would have given him a win.

TRACK SEASON

The track season was again notable for the splendid support given by younger athletes and it was mainly due to their efforts that we performed so creditably in the A and D grade Interclub Competition.

The Club was again hampered through the unavoidable absence of a number of its leading senior men and this was emphasised when the Club failed to gain any individual successes in the State Championships.

Although we did not perform so well as in recent years we feel that the Club is built on very substantial lines and with such promising athletic material still available individual success will naturally follow, yet athletes are reminded that a club built up of alround strength is better than a few individual champions.

Harry Gould was again our outstanding athlete during the Interclub season, his versatility is remarkable. His best performances were the 100 yards (10 secs.), 220 yards (22.3s.), 440 yards (50 secs.), broad jump (22'9") and Hop, step & jump (45'7"). He performed brilliantly to secure 4th place in the State 100 yards championship when his time was approximately 9.8s. After his showing in the heat of the 440 yards event he looked a winner in the final, but unfortunately he did not finish (due mainly to a bad attack of nerves); I think every athlete on the ground was sorry to see this happen. To the winner P. Eades of Manly Club we extend our congratulations. This young athlete is a fine type.

Arthur Gould, Keith Benson and Sid Watson are also to be congratulated for many splendid performances they recorded during the season. One of the most pleasing features during the season was the remarkable improvement shown by Ken Crawford over the 880 yards and mile distances. This athlete secured 4th place in the 880 yards and 3rd in the mile State Championships, his time for the mile was approximately 4m28½s. With intensive training Ken Crawford has demonstrated what can be accomplished by practically any athlete of promise who is prepared to train consistently and conscientiously. Next season Ken Crawford may easily develop into one of the finest middle distance runners the Club has yet produced.

Basil Dickinson was able to compete only occasionally during the season on account of a severe leg injury he sustained

during the rugby union football season. It is to be hoped that this fine athlete will come to the forefront again next season.

Captain Bill Mackenzie again proved to be a tower of strength during the season, being undefeated in the shot and discus in the Interclub, while he also performed well with the javelin. During a jaded period Bill Mackenzie was not seen to advantage in the State Shot and Discus events and to the astonishment he failed to win either event.

Malcolm Blakie and Bruce Burgess are young field games men of dist_nct promise and they should both be a decided acquisitions next season. Special mention must be given to junior Noel Dry who should develop into an excellent sprinter. His best performance was the winning of the Senior 220 yards Country Championship in 24 seconds and 2nd place in the 220 yards and 3rd in the 100 yards State Junior Championships. It is unfortunate that this young athlete cannot compete more regularly for the Club.

Another junior athlete who has shown distinct promise is Ken Kennedy, who was only once defeated in the D Grade over the 100 and 220 yards. He also gained 3rd place in the State Junior 220 yards Championship.

Mervyn Clissold competed mostly in B Grade this year and with keener competition he performed very creditably. Other athletes who show promise include Bob Ockenden, Jack Brady, Allan Painter, Peter McLennan, Jack Dowling, Russ Melville and Jack Stephenson.

Although Ern Evans did not compete regularly during the track season, he ran sufficiently well to secure 2nd place in the State 3 miles championship. Good sportsmanship is displayed to a large extent among members and while this condition exists the Club's progress is assured.

Midweek meetings held at Hurstville Oval brought about keen competition, although numbers were not quite as strong as in the previous season.

We met Western Suburbs in the annual challenge match at the Oval and we were defeated rather comfortably, although we fielded a weak team ... our congratulations to Western Suburbs.

Two special prizes have been awarded this season to Junior athletes for the "M.Moroney" and "Blackshaw" Trophies. The "M. Moroney" trophy was won by Noel Day for the most outstanding junior performance, being the winning of the Senior 220 yards Country Championship.

Mr. L. Blackshaw, Vice-President of our Club and President of the St. George Cricket Club, repeated his trophy to be awarded as follows: To the Junior athlete who, in the opinion of the Club Captain, has to the greatest extent of deportment, track appearance and performance generally enhanced the prestige of the Club during the season. W. R. Mackenzie, Captain, has awarded this trophy to a very fine type of junior - Ken Kennedy. The Club considers the "Blackshaw" trophy one of the most privileged awards presented during the season.

6TH ANNUAL ATHLETIC & CYCLING CARNIVAL: The carmival presented this year was equal in attraction to any previous carmival, but unfortunately public patronage was not as great as in the past, with an attendance of 3,000 to 4,000 people. The chief attractions this year were the appearance of Maroubra Surf Team, Fred & Maggie Everybody of 2CH and Duncan Gray the Olympic Cyclist.

To the many people who have extended financial assistance to us throughout the season, our grateful appreciation is extended.
