TWENTY THIRD ANNUAL REPORT

Presented to the members at the Annual General Meeting of the Club held at the Kogarah School of Arts on Friday, 25th May, 1945 at 8 p.m.

Gentlenen,

In presenting this report we record yet another year under adverse conditions, but despite this we have made progress. This being that we now have three grades in both the Track and Distance Seasons, Seniors, Juniors, Juveniles.

In a review of the Distance Season I think the best performance came from the Juvenile section when Jim Weeks ran second to J. Griffin of Botany in the 1 Mile Metropolitan Juvenile Cross Country Championship and Russell Scot also of our Club ran third, then two weeks later over the same distance Jim turned the tables finishing first and R. Scott was again third, our Junior nen are rather weak at the present time but in the near future when we have these Juveniles in their ranks we can hope to see the St. George Novice Teams we knew so well in the past.

Jack Hayes is still our best senior and his third place in the 10,000 metres Senior Scratch race was best performance for the season.

Track Season. In this part of the Club we feel the loss of our Seniors most, our Juniors and Juveniles have played their part and we should not have any regrets over the result of the Dunn Shield when we failed to score a point. I will say again that in the near future these boys will take their place in the Senior ranks and our Club will again be among the leaders in Track competition. In support of this many new Club records were made during the season by Junior and Juvenile nembers. K. Marshall a Juvenile competing with the D. Grade team in the Interclub Competition ran 440 yds. in 54.2s. the best for the season in that grade and made a new Junior best on record for the Club. The previous best was made by K. Simpson in 1932 54.4 secs.

In the C Grade of the Interclub competition E. Watson recorded 17 secs. for 120 Yds. Hurdles the best for the season in that grade also a new Junior best on record for the Club. In Club Championships he clocked 17.2 for the event, also, a new Club record previously hold by the late L. Breman made in 1929; he also made records in the Pole Vault at 9'6" and 220 Yds. Hurdles at 29.1.

W. Clauss a new Juvenile member, beat the previous best Junior Shot Putt record with a Putt of 37'2\frac{1}{2}" compared with J. Munfords 37' made in 1935.

In the "D" Grade, our sprinters recorded the best time for the season in the 440 Yds. Relay the time being 47 secs. We have some very good talent among the under 16 lads. For that reason we must keep then, Chaps like R. Wright, K. Marshall, E. Waudby, A. Jenkins, T. Williams, R. McCathy, K. Horsnell.

In the C Grade our sprinters made the best time for the 440 Yds. Relay at 46 secs. and shared with Eastern Suburbs the best for the 880 Yds. Relay at 1n.39s.

Here again we have a fine array of sprinters in R. Marshall, A. Stuart, N. Wray, R. Elliot, W. Lewis, R. Sheiles.

In the Junior State Championships, E. Watson was second in the 120 Yds. Hurdles and third in the Pole Vault. R. Skinner a newcomer to the distance section created a surprise by leading most of the way in the 2 miles event, and, if he had had the assistance of another St. George member he would have won this title. It was only A. Bold, the Botany boys experience, that won him the event - R. Skinner 2nd. 4 x 110 Relay St. George 3rd.

TRACK SEASON

This year we returned to Hurstville Oval and while we were able to conduct night meetings, membership improved and we were able to keep in close contact with most athletes.

Lights were again benned late in December, and while we conducted daylight meetings for the rest of the season they were not a success.

INTERCLUB COMPETITION

Three St. George teams competed. The "A" Grade was a failure - we were not able to field any sort of a team - no other club, I think, is as bad off as St. George in respect of her Senior Athletes. All are in the services and are not stationed near enough to lend a hand, for we know they would only be too happy to do so.

The "C" Grade team performed well to gain second place to the Police Club in this section; we were much stronger in flat events but were outclassed in the field games, but credit must be given to these young lads, for some, it was their first season. E. Watson was outstanding in jumps and hurdles and received some good assistance from a newcomer, J. Hayhow who, we hope to hear more from next season. The Sprinters I mention, in my review the middle distance men R. Skinner, G. Hand, R. Marshall, S. Sherringhan, C. Mastealler, all did good work.

The "D" Grade Team was very unlucky, they should have never lost this competition. If full support was forthcoming from all the juveniles available, this would not have happened. The Boteny team drew with St. George but we lost on the count of points for and against. This team has some of our best prospects for years, most of them were members of the outstanding team which won the Schools' Championship for the Hurstville Technical School.

TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT AND FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Gentlemen:

It gives me a great deal of satisfaction to present this report. We have made remarkable progress in the past season. One feature of the season was the large number of registrations with the A.A.A. The number of athletes registered (117) is a record for this Club, and in the near future St. George will again consider itself one of the leading "A" Grade Clubs in New South Wales.

DISTANCE SEASON

The Novice Cross Country Championship was a triumph for St. George. Although we were beaten for the individual title, our team finished in the next four places.

R. W. Skinner made a game bid to win, but K. Semple of Botany Harriers was too good on the day. The other members of the team, F. Slater, T. Corkhill and S. Randells deserve our praise. These men should make an excellent Senior team next season. Geoff. Hand, a promising Junior, also finished in the first ten.

The best of our Seniors were J. Hayes, S. Millington, and A. Gainsford. Hayes and Millington were seen in good form in the Senior Five Miles Scratch Race on July 29th, finishing second and third respectively. They did not, however, reprofuce this form in the Championship Events later in the season.

Our President, A. Gainsford, showed good form towards the end of the season, despite lack of training.

Jim Weekes was the outstanding Juvenile athlete during the Distance Season.
Running as a Junior he finished second to 0. Summerton of Western Suburbs in the
Junior Two Miles Scratch Race on July 29th, in the very good time of 10 mins. 15 secs.

He also gained fastest time in several open events and won the Schoolboys' Two Miles Cross Country Championship.

INTERCLUB COMPETITION

This season (1944-45) the Interclub Competition was held over two complete rounds for the first time. Although our "A" Grade did not do so well, our Seniors were responsible for some good performances. Our best athlete was A. V. Jenkins, who competed in "A" Grade for the first time this season. He was at his best over two miles and was beaten only once at this distance. He recorded 9 mins. 44.5 secs. for two miles, this being the best time for the season in "A" Grade.

- B. W. Sheiles is another old member who performed consistently in "A" Grade. He recorded the best Javelin performance of the Interclub Competition with a throw of 167 feet.
- A. Gainsford gave his usual support competing in walking events throughout the season.

Two new Senior members who show promise are L. Johnson and K. Robinson.
L. Johnson was our best Senior sprinter. His best performance was in beating the well known Western Suburbs Sprinter, D. Moroney, over 100 Yds. in 10.4 secs. Robinson proved to be a good High Jumper and should do well in the other Field Genes.

- S. Sheringham competed in Middle Distance events during the season and ran well on a number of occasions. E. Watson competed in Hurdles and Pole Vault, and put up some very good performances.
- S. Watson, who is in the A.I.F., supported the Club on several occasions while on leave.

The most pleasing feature of this season was the victory of our "C" Grade Tean who were Undefeated Premiers in their grade.

The sprint team (K. Harney, K. Marshall and R. Elliot) were outstanding. The best all-round sprinter was K. Marshall. He performed well at 100 Yards and 220 Yards and was undefeated over 440 Yards. His time of 54.5 secs. for 440 Yards was the best of the season.

- J. Hayhow was the best all-round athlete in the "C" Grade team, scoring 100 points in competition. He competed in Relays, Broad Jump, Hop, Step and Jump, Javelin, Discus and Hurdles. He recorded the best performance in the Broad Jump with 20 ft. 3 ins.
