Presented to Members at the Annual General Meeting held at Kogarah School of Arts, on 6th June, 1947

GENTLEMEN:

It is with pleasure that I present this 26th Annual Report, and it is gratifying to note that our membership this season is again a record, there being 177 members against 153 in the previous year.

Probably the outstanding performance during the past year was that of Bert Sheiles in regaining the Australian Javelin title at Perth, with a throw of 177ft. 81/2 ins. Another member who performed exceptionally well was our star Junior, Jim Weeks, who won the State Novice Cross country Championship in 27m23s creating a course record; the 5,000 Metres C.C. Championship in 16m.39s, and was selected to represent the State in the Australian Cross Country Championship in Brisbane.

The St. George District Schoolboy Championships again exceeded all expectations, with an entry of 824. This meeting has become one of the outstanding features of the Club's activities.

REVIEW OF THE TRACK SEASON:

Our performances in the Interclub Competition was disappointing, when it is remembered that the previous season weacquitted ourselves so creditably. In the early part of the Competition a certain amount of apathy was evident amongst members and it was only during the second round that our A Grade team showed improvement, winning five matches in a row. Bert Sheiles was a tower of strength throughout the competition and recorded the season's best performance with the Javelin with a throw of 183' 22", which created a State Native Record.

Ern Watson was one of our most consistent members and was successful in reducing the Club's 220 yards low hurdles record to 26.2s. Our sprinters, Charlie Campbell, Ron Hough, Ray Marshall, Peter Ford, all developed into a fine relay team and with University and Eastern Suburbs equalled the best 4 x 110 yds relay time of 44.4s. for the Interclub Competition. Jack Crealey, George Cross and Jim Bailey performed quite well over the middle distances. Jim Bailey, who is only a Junior, shows splendid promise; another Junior who has done well is Jack Everson who competed regularly in the A Grade Javelin, winning many points while also assisting the lower grades in other field games events.

Our President, A. Gainsford, again proved to be the Club's best walker, gaining many valuable points. It was pleasing to see the re-appearance of Bill Mackenzie, former Australian Shot Put and Discus champion; it was only during the later part of the season he was available and the many points he scored helped the run of victories the A Grade team had during that period.

Basil Dickinson, who appeared on a few occasions after some five years absence from the sport, also helped to boost the A Grade. Basil will be recalled by his brilliant performances of $24^{+}6\frac{1}{2}!!$ for the Broad Jump and $51^{+}2\frac{1}{2}!!$ for the Hop Step & Jump prior to the war; he has now gone to Bathurst where he has formed a club.

Our B Grade team was mainly made up of Arthur Gould, Fred Kitto, Charlie Hubble, Kevin Marshall, Kevin Harmey, Stan Sherringham, and they did reasonably well considering that on various occasions they had to fill the A Grade team.

The C Grade team was never at full strength and finished well down in the competition table the best performers were the consistent I.Ismay and Bill Cleary. The C Grade team commenced the season well but, owing to lack of support of senior men, finished well down in the competition. Lots of the younger lads lost interest when men had to be taken to fill higher grades and left their team weak. Men like K Horsnell, M.Rodgers, Jim Weeks, R.Skinner could have made the team quite a strong one if they had been regular in attendance. I.Ismay was the most consistent performer, helped by his fellow sprinter, W.Cleary, and the able manager of this grade, Mr. Gedge senior, has presented a trophy to I.Ismay for his efforts.

The D Grade did a little better with its young juniors and these young members should do better in the future; those who attended most were K.Pearce, G.Skinner, G.Southwood, N.Phelps, K.Marstaeller, D.Gleeson, J.Fry, K.Cross and R.Able.

Our Junior Grades were again among the best in the competition and if they had had full support all the season they could have won easily. T.O'Reilly was outstanding as a sprinter but was not always there. B.Passfield was another absence - in the latter part of the season we withdrew the No.1 Team and made a strong combination of the No.2 Team. D.Harvison was one of the most consistent competitors and, together with M.Gould, R.Keane, C Troup, B.Richards, J.Noakes, S.Everett, B.Francis and many others, they were unlucky to lose the competition.

A number of athletes were selected to contest a series of trial matches to enable selectors to choose the team to represent N.S.W. at the Australian Championships in Perth Your Club was represented by: B.Sheiles, C.Campbell, E.Watson, W.R.Mackenzie, P.Ford, J.Crealey, C.Oates, J.Mumford B.Sheiles, selected for the Javelin, proved himself by winning with a throw of 181ft. C.Campbell (100 and 220 yds), holder of the combined High Schools' title, did not do so well in the 100 yards but surprised everyone by finishing third to J. Treloar and R.Elvy in the 220 yards.

E.Watson, selected for the 120 yards hurdles, met the best hurdlers in the State and did not reach the final, but I think he gave one of his best hurdling performances. P.Ford joint holder of the G.P.S. broad jump title was selected for that event and the 100 yards, but appeared to be a little stale after a long season at school. J.Crealey (1 mile and 880 yards) did not have quite enough training owing to his studies, but recorded some good performances; he finished fourth in the mile and his time would be under 4m30s. In the 880 yards he again finished fourth in the final and the time under 2 mins. We expect to hear more of Jack in the future. C.Oates (pole vault) has not quite enough experience in this event, but should do better in future. J.Mumford competed in the discus but lacked training. W.R.Mackenzie (shot put and discus) has had bad luck owing to sickness and did not have the chance to train.

AUSTRALIAN TRACK CHAMPIONSHIPS: Held at Leederville Oval, Perth W.A., 25th and 27th January, 1947. New South Wales created history when it sent its twenty-odd team members all the way by plane and was successful in winning the 'Richard

Coombes" Championship Shield. Our Club was represented by B.W.Sheiles in the Javelin Throw, and he was successful in winning his third Australian Championship out of four attempts, with a throw of 177' 84".

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS: Held at Sydney Cricket Ground, 5th and 7th April. The St. George Club was well represented in all sections, and our main interest was in the Junior sprint events, where our star sprinter Charlie Campbell was rather unfortunate to meet such a robust athlete in P. Heath of Eastern Suburbs; he finished second in both the 100 and 220 yards, the times being 9.9s. and 22.4s. respectively. Another junior Jack Everson did well to gain second place in the Javelin and Hammer Throw events. Our old member, B.W. Sheiles, did not reproduce his early season's form and finished third in the senior Javelin Throw.

HURSTVILLE OVAL: Attendances were very good this season, and the officials and athletes worked well together. There was more interest taken in Club Championships held at the ground, and some fine performances were recorded. Several records were broken, and this makes us pay a tribute to the groundsmen - the Curator Mr. L. Dunbar and his assistant Mr. A. Collins - for their good work in keeping the ground in such good order.

Our team of officials are as good as that of any Club in the Association, and I am sure the athletes would want me to say thanks for their co-operation in

making the Tuesday nights the success they were.

TASMANIAN TRIP: Your Club received an official invitation from the Tasmanian Amateur Athletic Association to send a team to compete in their State Championships; this was accepted and a team of ten members: E.Watson, F.Kitto, R.Hough, G.Cross, C.Hubble, S.Sherringham, R.Kelleher, R.Bennett, E.Stockdale, J.Crealey with W.Ahern as Manager, made the trip.

The team was welcomed in Hobart by the President of the T.A.A.A., Mr. N. Hutton, and various officials and also entertained at a luncheon. We owe a special word of thanks to our old friend George Gosling and the Newtown Harriers for billeting all members of the team. We feel that we have done some good for athletics in Tasmania, and we will be remembered by the St. George Shield which, on behalf of the Club and the touring team, was presented to the Tasmanian A.A.A. for Junior Competition in connection with the State Championships.

The first day of the Championships were held at the North Hobart Oval on Saturday morning, 8th March, and the second day at Launceston on the 15th. We also have to thank the officials of the Launceston Branch for their hospitality during the team's stay at that city. We tender thanks, too, to our club member Len Johnson who, during anearly trip to Tasmania, was responsible for suggesting that our Club would like to tour their State and to our President, Mr. Gainsford, for all the travel arrangements.

Results: North Hobart Oval, 8/3/47. In the first heat of the 100 yards R.Hough met two good sprinters and finished 3rd to C.Shirley and H.Sheppard in 9.9 secs. F.Kitto won the second heat in 10.4s. and C.Hubble was 3rd in the third heat. Final: A.C.Shirley, 1st; F.Kitto, 2nd. 10secs. Broad Jump, C.Hubble (21'2½"); 440 Yards Hurdles, E.Watson, 60.6secs; 3 Miles Walk, R.Kelleher, 33m.0.6s.; 1 Mile, J.Crealey, 4m.37.6s. E.Watson had a few jumps in the Pole Vault and finished 2nd with 8'8". E.Stockdale threw the Javelin 119'5" and finished 2nd. Again in the 440 yards we met some very good sprinters and the result was:-A.Shirley, 1st; D.Foster, 2nd; R.Hough, 3rd; R.Bennett, 4th; C.Hubble, 5th - Time, 52.5s.

Second Day, York Park Launceston: The weather conditions were not as good as the first day and the times suffered. In the 220 yards our sprinters were again beaten by B.Fitzpatrick of Launceston, R.Hough was 2nd and F.Kitto 3rd in 23.4s. In the 120 yards hurdles E.Watson won well but owing to a faulty type hurdle he was ruled out. J.Crealey won the 880 yards and R.Bennett was 2nd in 2m.5s. 1 Mile Walk, R.Kelleher 1st (9m.4s.); Hop Step & Jump, E.Watson 2nd, J.Crealey 3rd; High Jump, C.Hubble 2nd (5'2"). In the 3 miles event our Junior G.Cross finished third to a very fine senior runner, W.Emmerten and P. Smith, in 16m.8.4s. St. George, represented by J.Crealey, R.Bennett, R.Hough and F.Kitto, easily won the medley relay in 3m.48.6s.

REVIEW OF THE DISTANCE SEASON: The performances of our Junior members of the Club were outstanding. Brilliant and popular Jim Weeks won the State Novice C.C. at Ramsgate in the course record time of 27m.23s. We also won the Teams Race with Juniors J.Weeks, T.Wagner, C.Marstaeller and E.Stockdale with a total of 22 points. In the State 5,000 Metres event Jim Weeks won a close race in 16m.39s., and the team finished second to Botany (17 points) with 29 points. Jim Weeks, after securing fastest time in most Junior events, capped a fine season by representing the State in the Australian Cross Country Championship at Brisbane.

In the Juvenile 1 Mile State C.C.C. our team was narrowly defeated by Botany, 23 to 26; the team consisted of Basil Wicks (3rd), Ken Marstaeller (5th), F.Thornton (6th) and G.Watts (12th). Basil Wicks was our best Juvenile, and as the season progressed he improved, and in the final scratch race he defeated the State champion, K.Melvin of Mascot, in 5m.10s, and our same team won the teams' title with 15 points.

Our senior runners did not perform with any success in teams events during

the season, and possibly the best showing was made by our veteran Charlie Weeks who gained 9th place in the 10,000 Metres C.C.C. his time being 35m.09s. This was a splendid effort when it is recalled that Charlie was State Cross Country Champion away back in 1925, when he also represented the State in the Australasian C.C.C. at Wellington, New Zealand.

Bob Skinner, with a broken season through illness, did well to gain 10th place in the 10,000 Metres and 8th in the State 10 Miles Championship. Les Williams was our first athlete to finish in the 15 Miles Road Championship, while veteran Ray Kelleher was our first athlete home in the full distance

marathon.

The Australian Cross Country Championship was held for the first time since the war at Rocklea Brisbane on 31st August 1946.
