The 29th Annual Report and Balance Sheet of your Club again reflects a year of great activity and success nearly equalling the previous year.

Membership of the Club is 241, only 9 below last years' record, the financial position also is still very sound.

Noteworthy features of the year activities was the successful promotion of the N.S.W. Marathon Championship, the St. George Schoolboy Championships and the International meeting of the English members of the British Empire Games Team. Another outstanding feature was the excellent

performances made by George Gedge Jnr., in winning the Australian 220 yds hurdles Championship and finally his selection in the

Australian Team for the British Empire Games held at Auckland New Zealand in February of this year.

We extend a sincere welcome to our new member, Aleksis Hakelis from Latvia who during the Track season gave a brilliant display of Javelin throwing, creating N.S.W. and Australian resident records with a throw of 200 ft. 12 ins..

Distance Athletes excelled themselves by winning the teams races of all Cross Country Championships at Campbelltown namely 10,000 Metres Senior, 5,000 Metres Junior, 1 Mile Sub-Junior.

In winning the blue riband 10,000 Metres Cross Country Championship members were successful in defeating Botany Harriers who had been invincible for many years.

INTERNATIONAL MEETING - N.S.W. V ENGLAND. Hurstville Oval, 17th February, 1950.

The Club was most fortunate in having the only appearance in Australia of the English members of the 1950 British Empire Games Team at Hurstville Oval.

The English Team included many notable athletes, namely Donald Finlay, who has represented England at three Olympic Games, two Empire Games, and holder of British 120 yds Hurdles Championship and is the record holder.

Finlay had the honor of swearing the Amateur Oath at the last Olympic Games, in London 1948 and members of the Club felt honored to have such an athlete appearing on our ground.

Jack Holden, European and British Empire Games Marathon Champion. Len Eyre 3 Mile British Empire Games Champion, Eyre in winning the 1 mile event on this night recorded the best mile performance ever seen on the Hurstville Oval, the time being 4 min. 17 sec.

Tim Anderson British Empire Games Pole Vault Champion, Anderson gave a brilliant exhibition of Vaulting clearing 12 ft. 6 ins. and just failing at 13 ft.

Another visitor was L. Valberg, a member of the Malayan Team, who contested the High Jump and 90 yds High Hurdles.

N.S.W. Athletes who did well at the meeting were J. Trealor 220 yds 21.6, G. Gedge 220 yds Hurdles 24.3sec. Broad Jump 23ft 2ins. Edwin Carr 440 yds 49.4ins.

Prior to the meeting our English visitors were extended a Civic Reception at the Hurstville Council Chambers by the Mayor of Hurstville, Alderman N. Macpherson, and members of the Council, it was greatly appreciated by the English team and A.A.A. and your Club Officials.

Club Officials can congratulate themselves upon the smooth organisation and control of the meeting before a large crowd and

our own athletes were impressed with the technique and appearance of our visitors.

SCHOOLBOY CHAMPIONSHIPS.

Kogarah Jubilee Oval, Saturday, 17th September, 1949.

Again, this was our most important meeting, the entries have now reached, I should think, An Australian Record (1914) representatives came from 29 Schools.

The organizing was, as usual, the work of Mr. F. Larcombe, of the Kogarah Intermediate High School, he had the full support of all Club Officials and the co-operation of the Kogarah Council and the Curator of the Oval - Mr. Jennings.

The weather was not good, but a high standard of Athletics was maintained and several records broken.

For the first time an Open Division Pennant was given and it was won by the Canterbury High School with 44 points, Sydney Technical High 40 points. The A. A. Gainsford Shield was won by the Kogarah Intermediate High School for the fourth successive time. The L.B. Williams Shield provided a tussle between the Hurstville South primary School and Kingsgrove and ended in a win for Hurstville South, for the third time with 41 points, Kingsgrove 38 points.

TRACK SEASON REVIEW.

HAWKESBURY 1st OCTOBER:

Prior to the commencement of the Inter-Club competition a team from your Club visited Hawkesbury Agricultural College, to compete in the Annual Match between Hawkesbury, Botany and Manly Clubs. The visit was a great success, both athletically, and socially.

Although, finishing only third to Botany and Hawkesbury in both A and Junior divisions, the A division acquitted themselves particularly well, in view of the fact that this team comprised mainly junior athletes.

Best performances were those of J. Vickers, F. Thornton, D. Harvison and T. Heron.

INTER-CLUB COMPETITION 1949:

A. B. C. D. E. and three under 16 teams were fielded by the Club in this competition. Once again our under 16 teams deserve first mention. The excellent performances, and splendid Club spirit shown by these youngsters, were not evident in the other grades.

The under 16 No. 1 team won their division of the competition, but, unfortunately, found Western Suburbs a little too strong in the final. This team seems destined not to win a premiership, having been runners-up for the past three seasons.

Athletes whose performances deserve mention were B.Mitchell, who established a new inter-club shot putt record, D. Stables who recorded the best broad jump of the season.

B. Stebbings, H. Ikin, B. David, J. Chambers and N. Hayman.

The A Grade, as usual, appeared very strong on paper, but, unfortunately, the attendance left much to be desired. The sprint team, comprising G. Gedge, N. Hume and D. Harvison performed creditably, whilst E. Watson and J. Vickers 120 yards and 220 yds. hurdles, and G. Gedge 220 yds. and 440 yds. hurdles were outstanding. J. Bailey and S. Everett performed well in middle distance events.

It was most unfortunate that a fractured collarbone forced F. Eggleton to retire early in the season, as his absence left the field games section very weak.

B. Grade finished well down in the competition. T. Heron was the only regular sprinter, and performed very well. F. Thornton, R. Mondel and K. Marstaeller gained points in middle distance events, whilst O. Lewis was a regular competitor in the l mile walk.

C. Grade performances were reasonably good. Best individual performances were those of G. Saiva, R. Miller and K. Randall, who were assisted by E. Etherton, L. Barton and K. Tanzer.

D. Grade failed to fulfil expectations, finishing well down in the competition. Failure is attributed to the poor attendance of athletes. Best Performances were those of J. Martin, J. McManus, and J. McGillian.

E. Grade finished well up in the competition, but, once again our athletes failed to attend the last few matches, This, undoubtedly, lost the team any opportunity of making the semi-finals. J. Raschke, K. Cross, T. Randall and W. Cleary were the mainstays, and were ably assisted by A. Flitton and J. English.

A brief summing up of the season's performances shows a favourably comparison with last year's efforts. Attendances were reasonably good, but an improvement must become evident before the Club can hope to win a premiership.

THE STATE TRIALS: Held at University Oval, 10th December, 1949.

The seven St. George athletes selected to compete in the state Trials were: G. Gedge (220 and 440 yds. Hurdles), J. Vickers (120 yds hurdles), E. Watson (220 yds. Hurdles), J. Bailey (880 yds.) B. Sheiles (Javelin), C. Oates (Pole Vault) and C. Smeal (3 Miles). G. Gedge finished second in both 220 yds Hurdles and 440 yds Hurdles, his times being 23.9 sec. and 54sec., whilst J. Vickers gained second placing in the 120 yds. Hurdles.

G. Gedges performances in the Trials gained him provisional State selection for the Australian Championships. Due to the response of Club members, the amount required to defray his expenses was soon in hand. George fully justified his selection by winning the 220 yds. Hurdles in 23.9sec., and just failing to catch Geoff Goodacre in the 440 yds. Hurdles his time being 54.5 sec.

On his excellent performances at these Championships, George was selected to represent Australia at the 1950 British Empire Games at Auckland, at his own expense. Your Club immediately opened an appeal to raise the necessary £100, and once again, members responded to the full.

Once again George proved that the Club's confidence in his capabilities was not misplaced, by gaining the final of the 440 yds. Hurdles and contributing magnificiently to the success of the 4 x 440 yds. Relay Team, his best time in the Hurdles was 53.9sec. made in the semi-final, and the teams time for the Relay was 3m 17.8sec.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Performances of Seniors and Juniors did not reach as high a standard as those of last year, but our Sub-Juniors did very well to secure third place in the Association Pennant. A new Senior member A. Hakelis, in his initial appearance for the Club, easily won the Javelin throw with an effort of 197'10¹/₂". G. Gedge gained second place in the broad jump. C. Smeal was third in the 6 mile. T. Randall through his perserverance in the 120 yds Hurdle events gained third place in the State title. Our only success in teams events was a third place in the 3 miles and the Juniors a third place in the 1 mile Medley. The Sub-Juniors placings were J. Chambers won the Broad Jump 21'1¹/₄ and second in the Hop, Step and Jump. In the Shot Putt B.Mitchell was second and B. Stubbings third. Also in the 90 yds Hurdles B. Stubbings second, H. Ikin third, in the 4 x 100.yds. Relay the St. George team was third.

TASMANIA: 8th - 19th March, 1950.

A team of twelve Club athletes visited Tasmania to compete in their Championships. It was unfortunate that sickness of several members of the team greatly handicapped their performances. The excellent hospitality shown by the T.A.A.A. was greatly appreciated by all.

JUBILEE OVAL:

Training facilities were available at Jubilee Oval throughout the track season, and attendances were extremely exceptionally good.

It was noticed that members trained more seriously apparently realising the importance of proper training.

DISTANCE SEASON REVIEW.

The past Distance Season was the Club's most successful for many years.

In winning Sub-Junior, Junior and Senior Teams Championships at the State Cross Country meeting at Campbelltown on Saturday, 23rd July, a club record was created.

On the day, St. George were unbeatable as a team, with R. Patchett 3rd, K. Semple 5th, F. O'Hanlon 6th, J. Semple 9th, J. Marshall 10th and F. Slater 13th, they scored 46 points against Botanys 83 points.

Juniors B. Wicks 2nd, L. Thomas 3rd, G. Watts 6th and K. Marstaeller 7th, were easy winners with 18 points to Western Suburbs 28 points.

The Sub-Junior team comprised of L. Barton 1st, B. Voller 2nd, B. David 3rd and J. Earls 5th scored 11 points out of a possible 10 to defeat Botany with 25 points.

With one win, two seconds and three thirds in the individual titles in addition to the three victories in the teams championships, our Club has good reason to feel proud of its efforts.

The 5 Miles Novice Cross country cha pionship run at Scarborough Park on July 9th was a triumph for St. George with F. O'Hanlon winning in the smart time of 27 min. equalling

J. Plummer's race record.

J. Marshall was fourth and our team finished in third place behind Botany and Western Suburbs.

The Marathon Championship held at Rockdale saw our team with 25 points fill third place, our best performer being C.Smeal in 5th position.

The State 10 miles event run at Randwick Racecourse gave our team another minor placing, this time they were second to Botany.

C. Marstaeller in fifth place was our best performer.

St. George filled 3rd place to Botany and South Sydney at Manly in the 15 miles Teams Championship,

On this occasion F. O'Hanlon in 8th place was first St. George man in. In addition to the N.S.W. Championships our Club was represented in the Queensland Junior 5,000 metres and Senior 10,000 metres cross country championship.

On 11th June, our Junior team of four comprising K. Marstaeller (Manager-Captain) B. Wicks, L. Thomas and G.Watts competed in the 5,000 metres event.

B. Wicks finished 2nd to K. Johnstone (Botany) who established a new record over the Toowong course with a run of 17 min. 13 sec. while K. Marstaeller was 3rd.

Our Team with 20 points was second to Botany 16 points.

A senior team managed by A. Henderson, consisted of K. Duncan (Captain) C. Marstaeller, K. Semple, J. Semple, F. Slater, F. O'Hanlon, J. Marshall, T. Kelly and G. Skinner, took part in the 10,000 metres run over the Rocklea National Championship course.

The event was won by the Queensland Veteran G.McGahey who after running the first three miles in 15min.15sec. went on to win by 45sec, in the smart time of 34min. 14 sec. only 16 sec. outside G. Campbell's course record of 33min. 58sec.

R. Cole (Toowong) who ran 5th in the N.S.W. title was 2nd to McGehey, his time being 35 min.

The St. George trio, K. Semple, C. Marstaeller and J. Semple ran third, fourth and fifth.

With a total of 17 points Toowong defeated St. George with 23 points and Maine 46 points.

The Club Championships showed F. O'Hanlon as the most improved distance runner in the Club.

In addition to winning the State Novice title, O'Hanlon won the Club 15 miles, and was 2nd in the 10 miles and third in both the 10,000 metres and 5 miles road.

K. Semple demonstrated his fitness in winning the 5 miles road championship for the third consecutive time, while he was second in the 10,000 metres and third over 10 miles, not

This was Wicks' third consecutive win the Club's 2 mile Championships. This youthful athlete also had his share of success in the open events with a win over 2 miles in a scratch event at Randwick Racecourse, fastest time over $l\frac{1}{2}$ miles at Manly and sharing fastest time over 2 miles at Ramsgate, with J. Pierce (W.S.)

K. Marstaeller, L. Thomas, G. Watts, B. Hayfield, J. Hugo and A. Williams, all performed creditably in the Junior events.

With such talent available in our Junior ranks we can look forward to a bright future.

Our Sub-Juniors were of high standard and displayed exceptional team work.

It would be difficult to find a team of the calibre of L. Barton, B. Voller, B. David, J. Earls, K. Sailland and R. Lake.

L. Barton, who won the State Championship and gained fastest time in the Bot ny open proved his worth until he turned sixteen, then he finished the season as a Junior.

B. Voller was the Club 1 Mile Championship winner and would have taken out the State Title only for being wrongly directed by an official.

This lid also proved his value in winning the 1 mile scratch race at Randwick and running fastest time in the Eastern Suburbs and Ramsgate opens.

Success also came to our Club in the open handicaps with A. Blyth and B. Crisp winning the Eastern Suburbs Senior and Junior runs.
