30th ANNUAL REPORT AND BALANCE SHEET

Presented to Members at the Annual General Meeting held at Kogarah School of Arts, on 27th April, 1951

Gentlemen:

The 30th Annual Report and Balance Sheet of your Club reflects a year of great activity.

Our membership suffered slightly, our total being 205. The downward trend was mainly in the Juniors and Sub-Juniors, and it is hoped that this will be arrested during the coming season.

We again promoted the N.S.W. Marathon Championship at Rockdale and this year it included a team from Victoria; also the St. George Schoolboy Championships. These events were even a greater success than the previous year.

On the track the best performances came from A. Hakelis and J. Balley in the Australian Championships at Hobart. Hakelis won the Javelin and his throw has only been beaten on one previous occasion when Starley Ley of New Zealand competed in 1927.

Jim Bailey proved one of Australia's best half-milers and is the only athlete to best Im 55s twice in Australian Championships.

In the Jubilee Celebrations held at the Cricket Ground on Easter Saturday, G. Gedge returned to form and won the 200 metres and 400 metres Hurdles defeating the Australian 440yds. Hurdles champion, G. Goodacre, E. Watson was also successful in the 110 metres Hurdles, defeating Andre Marie the French athlete.

In reviewing the past track season we must consider J. Bailey, G. Gedge and A. Hakells as our outstanding Olympic prospects.

In the Distance Season our Seniors were not so successful, but the Club proved very strong in the Juvenile and Sub-Junior sections. In the N.S.W. Championships we filled the first four places in the Juvenile and three out of four in the Sub-Junior and won both teams' events.

ST. GEORGE SCHOOLBOY CHAMPIONSHIPS

Held at Jubiles Oval, Carlton, on Saturday, 16th September, 1950

Once again this meeting was a huge success. The conditions on the day were ideal for athletics and the club's innovation of presenting an inscribed medallion for each record broken or equalled brought out the best in the schoolboys and the Club presented 23 medallions. The points score was keenly contested, Canterbury High winning the open division, Kogarah won the secondary division with 150 points. The Primary section was won by Rockdale with 29 points. Mortdale 281 points, 2nd.

The presentation of trophies was made by the Mayor of Harstville, Ald. N. Macpherson, and the Mayor of Kogarah. Ald. C. R. Sweeting.

Our thanks for the success of this meeting go to the organiser, Mr. F. Larcombe, to the curator of the oval, Mr. Jennings, and to the Kogarah Council for its assistance.

Another pleasant innovation was the local Red Cross taking over the catering arrangements and the Club were able to look after its officials.

Track Season Review

HAWKESBURY, 23rd SEPTEMBER:

The annual visit to Hawkesbury Agricultural College for the quadrangular match between St. George, Manly, Botany and Hawkesbury Clubs, marked the opening of the 1950-51 track season. A team of 25 Club athletes made the trip, which once again proved to be an athletic and social success.

Our athletes were well to the fore, keenly contesting all events. Wins were recorded by the following; E. Watson (120yds hurdles), E. Etherton (880yds,), It. Stubbings (high jump), D. Harvison (220yds.), H. Walsh (shot putt), with St. George team winning the 440yds, relay.

INTER-CLUB COMPETITION:

A. C. D. E. and three Under 16 teams were entered in this competition,

A GRADE: Although finishing only fifth in the competition, the A grade team was unlucky to lose several matches by a very slender margin.

Congratulations to J. Bailey for establishing a new inter-club record of 1m.56.7s, for the 880yds., and A. Hakelis, whose javelin throw of 203'82" also created a new inter-club record. The consistent performances of these two athletes marks them as potential Olympians.

G. Gedge, N. Hume and D. Harvison were the mainstays in sprint events. F. Thornton gave noteworthy assistance in 880yds, events. Other consistent point-scorers throughout the season were: E. Eggleton (field games), B. Watson (hurdles), S. Everett (middle.distance), J. Hancock and A. Gainsford (walking events). C GRADE: This was the Club's most successful team, tying with Western Suburbs for the grade premiership, but, unfortunately, losing winning honours on the count of averages. T. Heron shone as the sprint star, his time of 23s, for the 220yds, being the fastest recorded for the season in this particular grade, J. Iverson's discus throw of 112'11", and H. Ikin's 26,5,s for 220yds, hurdles, were also best performances. The C graders added further laurels by establishing the fastest times for 440yds, and 880yds, relays. Valuable points in middle-distance events were credited to F. Slater, J. Chiswell and L. Barton, with O. Lewis the mainstay in walks.

D GRADE: Efforts provided disappointing results, and the team finished well down in seventh place. Best performances were those of B. Stalker, E. Arnold and N. Hayman,

E GRADE: Continual defeat in matches is attributed to lack of club representation in many events, particularly field games, when valuable points were lost through absence of competitors. This team also finished in seventh place. Best individual performance was that of K. Tanzer who recorded fastest time for 220yds, (24s.), W. Cleary, B. Parsons, K. Thew, A. Hardy and K. Randall also gave performances worthy of mention.

UNDER 15: Defeat by Botany in the last match once again snatched victory from our No. 1 team. Loss of this vital match relegated the team to third position, for, although tying for second place with Western Suburbs on match points, it lost on averages. Club members also registered best performances in this grade, namely, D. Stables, hop step & jump (41'91"), and K. Short, 10'yds, hurdles (12.5s.). D. Kennedy, K. Short and D. Stables were well to the fore in the sprints; D. Wilson, W. McAllister and B. Toovey gave good performances in middle-distance events, whilst S. Hill recorded some fine efforts in jumping events.

A brief summing-up of the season's performances revealed a marked improvement in both attendances and performances. With so many of our younger athletes showing great promise, and seniors striding rapidly into championship class, next season should see St. George providing formidable opposition.

WOLLONGONG, 6th JANUARY:

A strong team of Club athletes visited Wollongong to compete in a match against Illawarra A.A.C. Club members registered some particularly fine performances, J. Bailey, E. Watson, G. Gedge, F. Thornton and T. Heron oil recording wins in their respective events.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS, 3rd, 10th and 17th FEBRUARY:

After a comparatively unsuccessful period, our senior athletes are once more joining the ranks of State champions and "near champions."

A. Hakelis outclassed all opponents in winning the javelin title with a record throw of 208'82". J. Bailey recorded the good time of 1m.55.1s. in the 880yds., and finished second in the 1 mile. J. Vickers won the 120yds. hurdles from club-mate E. Watson. G. Gedge was placed second in the 440yds, hurdles, and third in the 440yds. F. Eggleton gained second place in the discus and third in the shot putt. The junior pole vault title went to A. Briggs, with an excellent yault of 10'6", N. Langby was placed third in the high jump.

In the sub-junior section, D. Wilson was successful in winning the 888yds. K. Short second in the 90yds, hurdles and third in the 100yds, whilst G. Luscombe ran an even race to fill third place in the 440yds. Second and third placings in the hop step & jump went to D. Stables and S. Hill respectively.

St. George figured prominently in the relays. Sub-juniors won the 1 mile medley, and gained third placing in both the 4x110 and 4x220 events. Juniors were successful in winning the 4x220 and were placed third in the 4x110, with the seniors taking second place in the 1 mile medley and third in the 4x110.

HURSTVILLE OVAL:

Inclement weather and severe lighting restrictions had an adverse effect effect upon Tuesday night meetings. In the early part of the season heavy rain flooded the oval, necessitating several cancellations, and lighting restrictions made it necessary to commence events at 5.30 p.m. for the remainder of the season.

The conditions appreciably affected attendances as many members found the time period inconvenient. Every effort was made to assist members, but urder the severe handicap we were forced to restrict activities.

AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS, TASMANIA, MARCH:

Seven members of the Club were selected as members of the N.S.W. Team to compete in the Australian Championships, held in Hobart on 3rd and 5th March. They were: A. Hakelis, C. Smeal, J. Bailey, G. Gedge, E. Watson, F. Eggleton and J. Vickers, the two latter withdrawing from the team.

A. Hakelis again proved that he is Australia's best exponent of the javelin by taking the title with a fine throw of 204'22'. J. Bailey won the 889yds, in the near-record time of 1m,54.9s. Jim has been outstanding among the half-milers this season, and 1552 should see him a strong contender for Olympic honours.

G. Gedge was narrowly defeated by G. Goodnere in the 440yds, hurdles.

E. Watson reached the finals of both the 120yds, and 220yds, hurdles, Suffering a stitch after travelling five miles greatly affected C. Smeal's chance in the Marathon. Despite this handicap, he finished in fourth place.

These achievements are one of which our Club may be justly proud.

E. Watson proved too good for Frenchman Andre Marie in the 110

metres hurdles. He won the event in 15.2s.

The 800 metres was won in impressive style by J. Balley in 1m.58.1s.,

with F. Thornton a good third.

A. Hakelis gave a brilliant display of javelin throwing, culminating at his record throw of 207'2\(\frac{1}{2}\)\(\frac{1}{2}\).

Consistent performer F. Eggleton was second in the discus throw

and shot putt.

Distance Season Review

The most outstanding feature of the past season was the winning of all five club championships by C. Smeal, a performance previously unequalled since there have been five Club championships.

Smeal's natural ability was demonstrated over all distances from 3 miles to the Marathon.

Apart from his club performances, Smeal finished second in the State 15 miles championship and with 5th in both the N.S.W. and Victorian Marathon titles.

Other senior athletes to perform well were F. O'Hanlon, H. Duncan and J. Marshall.

The point score was again won by A. Gainsford with scratch runner C. Smeal 2nd and L. Williams 3rd.
