37th ANNUAL REPORT AND BALANCE SHEET

PRESENTED TO MEMBERS AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD
AT THE KOGARAH SCHOOL OF ARTS ON MAY 23, 1958

Gentlemen,

This year saw marked improvement in the performances of individual athletes but was disappointing from an inter-club competition point of view.

Five athletes, A. Thomas, F. Thornton, D. Wilson, B. Miles and M. Miles were chosen in the team to represent N.S.W. at the Australian Track and Field Championships at Brisbane. The most successful athlete was Albert Thomas who won the 3 mile. Dennis Wilson almost caused an upset in the 1 mile when he opened a big lead on the rest of the field until the last lap when Herb Elliott put in a brilliant run followed by Merv. Lincoln and Terry Sullivan. Dennis finished a close 4th but one cannot help but wonder what might have happened had not Dennis been spiked in the heel in December and forced to rest up for nearly a month.

Five athletes were also chosen to represent N.S.W. in a Victoria versus N.S.W. match at Olympic Park in December 1957. In this team Dennis Jolliffe replaced Frank Thornton. Once again Albert Thomas was our most successful competitor winning the 3 mile. Dennis Wilson ran very well to record 1 min. 52.7 secs. to come 3rd in the 880 yards.

Good performances were put up at various night invitation meetings. Barry and Mert Miles hurdled very consistently gaining places nearly every time they competed. Dennis Jolliffe recorded 46ft. 6½ ins. to win a Hop, Step & Jump while Don Scott a newcomer to the Club jumped well to record 24ft. 10ins. to come 3rd in a long jump.

Once again Albert Thomas was our most successful member. Alby was awarded the Richard Coombes Memorial Medallion for the most outstanding Track and Field Athlete for 1957-58. When one looks at his performances it is not difficult to see why he received this award. Alby won the 3 miles events at the Victoria versus N.S.W. meeting, the Australian Track and Field Championships, and the NSW State Championships. He also won a 1 mile on November 29 in a N.S.W. resident record time of 4min. 1.5s. and created a new Australian Open and Australian National record of 13 min. 26 secs. in winning a 3 mile on December 8.

Alby is also our only representative at the British Empire Games at Wales.

Club Membership of 150 is on a par with last year's

149 but it is difficult to reconcile this number with our poor inter-club performances.

Attendances at Hurstville Oval were satisfactory and as this is our main source of income our financial position is also satisfactory even after allowing £35 towards expenses of athletes to compete in the Australian Track and Field Championships.

The distance season was one of our best ever even though no wins were recorded in championships. The numbers rolled up at Scarborough Park each Saturday and it was unfortunate that we could not field a team in the sub-juniors in the State 1 mile Championship as here we lost a sure 1st in the teams race. The juniors were in a similar position but the seniors scored an unexpected 3rd in the 10,000 metres teams race.

A special congratulation to Kevin McCormack who showed grit and determination to finish the 50 kilometres road walk Championship to come in 3rd.

SCHOOLBOY CHAMPIONSHIPS

Were conducted on the Kogarah Jubilee Oval on September 14, 1957 in very pleasant weather conditions. Entries in these Championships improve each year and this year saw 2976 entries from 17 Primary and 20 Secondary Schools in the district. Once again congratulations to our Organiser Mr. P. Larcombe for his sterling work and also to the curator of the Oval for his preparation of the ground which, with its two sprint tracks enabled the programme to continue with clock work precision.

Nineteen new records were broken (including two new events) and three records equalled. Some new records were shared by up to three competitors. Five of these records better existing CHS records. This will give an indication of the standard of the performances A. Gibson 10.8 under 14 100 yds.: R. Dye 20 ft. 6½ ins. under 15 broad jump: K. Creed 12.0 90 Yards Hurdles and 10.5 100 Yds. under 15 and J. White 11.2 under 13 100 Yards.

The Primary School Pennants resulted in a win for Hurstville in the Junior with 41 points and De La Salle Kingsgrove in the Senior with 64½ points. The L.B. Williams Shield was won by Marist Bros. Penhurst with 78 points. In the Secondary School Pennants Hurstville won the Juvenile with 54 points Sydney Tech. High and Sydney High tied in the Junior Pennant with 72 points each and the Senior with 67 points went to Sydney Tech. High who also won the A.A. Gainsford Shield for the highest aggregate among the Secondary Schools.

TRACK SEASON

INTER-CLUB COMPETITION

Teams were fielded in A, B, D and E Grades and two teams in the Under 16 yrs. Junior Grade.

A GRADE

Here we finished 7th out of 8.

We have the quality but not the quantity although a little more team spirit would not go amiss. It was unfortunate that teams members suffered injury so early in the season. Keith Short, John Lester and Dee Page were out for nearly all the season and it was on these men we placed so much reliance for points in sprints, hurdles and field games. Frank Thornton and Dennis Wilson were also on the injured list. It was necessary to comply with inter-club rules

and up grade athletes from the lower grades which meant struggling for points in all grades. Our most consistent A Graders were Barry and Mert Miles, Frank Thornton Dennis Wilson, John Burne, Dennis Jolliffe, Col Clarke, Don Scott and Fred Eggleton who carried the team in respect of the field events.

B GRADE

Finished 6th out of 10.

This was the cinderella grade as its members were so often required to compete in A Grade. Middle Distance and Hurdles were our only strength. The most consistent competitors were Kev. Taylor, Sid Preston, Bruce Crewes and Barry Webb.

D GRADE

Finished 6th out of 12.

Attendance of members as in all grades was somewhat irregular. Dick Short scored many points in Sprints but in the latter part of the season was required to run B Grade. Bruce Crewes and Barry Webb were of assistance in the quest for points as were middle distance men Ron Gribble and Kev. Bell.

E GRADE

Finished 8th out of 10.

Grahame Bonney John Ferguson and Bill Bowers were consistent performers in this grade whilst Morrie McCormack tried hard in the sprints and particularly in trying to arrange relay teams.

JUNIOR GRADES

Junior 1 finished 8th out of 10.

Junior 2 finished 5th out of 8.

These results are disappointing as, individually we had some of the best Sub-Juniors in the State competing. Ken Creed, Brandon Briggs, Noel Forbes were a very strong sprint team. Noel and Ken gained many points in the hurdles whilst Roger Dye did his share in the jumps and Shot Putt. Lin Jolliffe was most regular in competing in the Jumps and Terry Jarvis did well in the middle distance.

In all, the results are disappointing. Perhaps we entered too many teams although the Club Membership would not indicate this. It just seems that the athletes are not interested in competing at inter-club. Admittedly this is not true of the beginning of the season but it is of the end when we have a great deal of difficulty in fielding teams. There seems to be a wastage of athletes who are available through lack of direction and I think that a team manager is an absolute essential. A

great deal of thought should go into the next season so that this year's performance will not be repeated.

HURSTVILLE OVAL

The attendances at Hurstville Oval were good and the competition particularly amongst the younger members was very keen.

Our Championships on the Oval were interrupted by rain and one of our nights clashed with a night carnival on the Sports Ground. Unfortunately some of our best men were unable to compete in the Championships as they were required to compete at night carnivals either a few days before or a few days after our events.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Were again held over three days, first day of heats and two days of finals. There was good representation from our Club.

Albert Thomas was again our most consistent performer. He won the State 3 mile Championship and was second in the 1 mile. During the season he created records in two events. A N.S.W. resident record of 4 min. 1.5 secs. for the 1 Mile and 13 min. 26 secs. to break the Australian Open and Australian National record for the 3 Miles. He has been selected in the Australian team to compete at the British Empire Games.

Frank Thornton ran second to Barry Almond in the 880 yds. in the time of 1 min. 52.4 secs.

Barry Miles hurdled well and recorded the time of 15 secs. to come second in the 120 Yds. Hurdles. Mert Miles also hurdled well in recording 55.5 secs. over the 440 Yds. Hurdles.

In the Juniors Kev. Taylor was the only one to show with a fourth in the 2 mile in 10 min. 7.4 secs.

The Sub-Juniors Noel Forbes and Ken Creed gained second and third places in the 90 Yds. Hurdles in times of 11.8 secs. and 12.0 secs.

STATE RELAY CHAMPIONSHIPS

Club members combined well in the relays and obtained good results. Organisation could have been better as there was some last minute rushing to fill the teams through withdrawals and injury.

The Seniors surprised by running second in the 1 Mile Medley Relay. This was somewhat a makeshift team as at nine o'clock the night before we were trying to get starters. The Seniors also ran second in the 2 Miles Relay.

The Sub-Juniors returned the best results by winning their Mile Medley. All members of this team ran exceptionally well, but even in this team there was a last minute replacement.

AUSTRALIAN TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Australian Track and Field Championships were held in Brisbane this year.

Five of our members were selected to represent their State:

Albert Thomas starred in what was possibly the most exciting event on the programme, the 3 miles in which he and Dave Power fought out a very close finish running neck and neck over at least the last 200 Yards.

Dennis Wilson almost caused an upset in the 1 Mile when he opened up a good lead on the rest of the field. Dennis was unfortunate to have been spiked in the heel in December and was consequently forced to rest up otherwise there may have been a different story to tell. Dennis appeared to lack his usual finish but still came a close fourth. He proved his class by running fifth in the 880 Yards.

DISTANCE SEASON REVIEW

We were well represented at the official opening at Centennial Park being one of the largest group of marchers. A competition march was conducted from the gates of the

Showground to the centre of the Park. Had we a Club flag at the time we could have won this march past. This lack has now been remedied.

The inaugural address was made by our Club President Mr. A.A. Gainsford as Senior Vice-President of the A.A.A. of N.S.W. in the absence of the President.

From a Club Membership point of view the season was very successful. For the first time for many years the Seniors outnumbered all other Grades and the strength continued throughout the season.

Once again Albert Thomas was our outstanding athlete in the State and Club Championship events, his best performances being second in the 10,000 Metres Cross Country State Championships at Centennial Park and winning 5 Miles and 10,000 Metres Club Championships. Dennis Wilson ran very well throughout the season coming second in the State 5 Miles Novice Championship.

Our Junior Team was not large and in point of fact they could not field a team of four for the State 5,000 Metres Team Race. Brian English ran very strongly from scratch and recorded excellent times. The Juniors secured third place in the 8 Miles Road Relay which was held at the Naval Air Station Nowra.

Sub-Juniors lacked quantity but not quality. Kev. Taylor, Dave Chisholm and Sid Preston had quite a tussel during the season. Dave came out on top for the most number of fastest times. This grade lost a sure first in the 1 Mile Cross-Country State Championship team race when they only fielded three starters. In the final result we obtained second and third places with Kev. Taylor and Dave Chisholm and Sid Preston came in sixth. We only needed another run to take the teams race. The sub-juniors suffered their first defeat in the 4 Miles Relay when they ran two seconds slower than the very good Botany team.

The Juveniles had a good roll up each week. The competition was keen although I think some of them ran "slow" on occasions. Kev. Moore had the edge on Lin Jolliffe in the most number of fastest times.
