44th ANNUAL REPORT AND **BALANCE SHEET**

Presented to Members at the Annual General Meeting held at Electricity House, Hurstville on Thursday, 20th May, 1965

Gentlemen.

The 44th Annual Report and Balance Sheet of your Club is presented to you tonight and it will reveal, after you have perused it, that during the 12 months we have improved quite substantially on the previous

year's performances.

Albert Thomas, once again, proved himself the best athlete in our Club, but his performances were not as good as those of the previous year. The outstanding feature of his running during the year was his winning of the Australian Mile in 4 mins. 5.9 secs. and in doing so he

won for the fourth year in succession, which is a record for this event.

Albert's running in the Australian championships gained him selection in the 1964 Tokyo Clympic Games, an honour ne gained previously when he represented Australia at Melbourne, 1956, and Rome, 1960. At Tokyo Albert was dogged by illness and his performances were not nearly as good as those in Australia and in the 5,000 metres he could only gain 11th place in the second heat, recording 14 mins. 27.8 secs., and in the second heat of the 1,500 metres he was near the end of the field in the slow time of 3 mins, 54.9 secs.

During the State championships he won the 1 Mile once again in 4 mins. 5.8 secs., the 3 Miles in 13 mins. 44.8 secs. and the 6 Miles in 28 mins, 30.6 sec., which is the first time these three events have been

won at a State championship meeting.

During the year Albert has run in practically every State and New Zealand and his best time for the Mile was 4 mins. 3.5 secs. at the Moomba Carnival in Melbourne. One of his best performances during the year was when he beat Ron Clark over the 2,000 Metres in 5 mins. 9 secs., which was only 0.8 secs. outside the Australian record and this time was made just prior to going to Tokyo. Later in the year he again beat Ron Clark over this distance in 5 mins. 19 secs.

Len Chinnery had another excellent year. He won the State Discus 159 ft. 11 ins., Shot Put 50 ft. 7 ins. and during Inter-club he was never

once beaten in these events.

Maurice Smith continued to improve and he won the State High Jump at 6 ft. 2 ins. and his performances in Inter-club in this event, also 120 yards Hurdles and the Long Jump have been most gratifying.

Gary Friend is improving in sprinting and he has got down to 10.3 for the 100 yards and in the Mentone Match he won the 220 in 22.8 and he finished third in the State Long Jump, 23 ft. 6½ ins., which was not as good as his previous year in jumping when he cleared 24 ft. 3 ins.

Ron Gribble has had an excellent season and he is the most improved athlete in the Club and his performance in the State 880 Yards by gaining second place in 1 min. 57 secs, was very good, keeping in mind that he also does well in long distance and during the year he ran in two Marathons and his performance in the Australian Marathon of 2 hrs. 41 mins. 52 secs, is his best performance in this event.

Peter Lawler has shown excellent improvement with the Javelin and in the State Title he finished second with a three of 201 ft. 216 inc.

in the State Title he finished second with a throw of 201 ft. 31/2 ins. Later he finished fifth in the Australian Title with a fine throw of 213 ft. 71/2 ins., which is the best performance ever recorded in this event by

a St. George athlete. Congratulations, Peter.

St. George had some excellent State Relay Teams. In the 4 x 1 Mile Relay the team: Hancock Rooke, Proud and Thomas, recorded 16 mins.

56.8 secs., a State record. — (Flashback) — State Championships, University Oval, 4th February, 1933. 4 x 1 Mile Relay. 1st, St. George. Team: Albert Blyth, Alleyn Gainsford, Claude Stark, Gordon Keep. Time: 18 mins. 49.8 secs. A State record.

In the 4 x 880 Yards Relay St. George were beaten inches by Eastern Suburbs and were given the same time, 7 mins. 49.2 secs., the team

consisting of Thomas, Taylor, Gribble and Hancock.

Bob Seibokas is one of our most outstanding junior athletes and he has also shown considerable improvement in the Javelin. Last year he threw the javelin 175 ft. 4 ins., but during the past year he won the State Junior Title with a throw of 195 ft. 2 ins., he was second in the Australian Title with 200 ft. 1 in. and then he was invited to compete in the Senior Australian Javelin Championships and with the

heavier javelin he threw it 207 ft. 3 ins.

John Hancock is easily our most improved junior athlete. Throughout the year he has run magnificently and he capped a wonderful season when he won the Australian Junior Mile Title in 4 mins. 13.8 secs., but in Inter-club he even ran better still when he recorded 4 mins. 11 secs. for the distance. In the Australian Junior 880 Yards Title he finished third in 1 min. 53.5 secs., which is his best time in this event. Apart from his excellent performances in the Australian Championships he won both the State 880 in 1 min. 55.4 secs. and the Mile in 4 mins. 16.5 secs. Officials of the Club at this stage are wondering whether he will finally emulate Albert Thomas for at this time he is actually running far better times than Albert and it would appear that he will go on improving, especially with more experience.

Peter Dwyer is an outstanding Sub Junior Athlete. He won the State Sub Junior Mile in 4 mins. 27.2 secs. and he also won the St. George Schoolboy 1/2 Mile Championship in 2 mins. 0.5 secs., which created

Club best on record for Sub Junior.

Our Junior Relay Team, 4 x 880 Yards, consisting of Peter Dwyer, Vic Byrne, Brian Clark and John Hancock, won the State Title in 7 mins.

59.4 secs., which created a Club best on record.

Brian Lawler, one of our most promising Sub-Juniors, finished second in the State 120 Hurdles in 16.5 secs. and he created best Interclub performance of 5 ft. 7 in. in the High Jump and 8 ft. 6 in. in the Pole Vault. He finished off a good season by representing New South Wales against Queensland in the Sub Junior Match.

Vic Byrne is another promising athlete and during the track season he finished third in the Junior 2 Mile in 9 mins. 41.4 secs.

Ken Barber commenced the season in excellent style when he ran the 100 Yards in 10.3, but towards the end of the season he became jaded and did not run nearly so well, but this fine young athlete will

certainly show big improvement next year.

David Stephenson is the most promising juvenile in the State. He has recorded 10.6 for the 100 Yards Inter-club, 10.7 at School and he has run 220 in 24.1. In the State Age Championships he won the 100 Yards in 11.2, 220 in 24.7 and 60 Yards Hurdles in 8.8 secs. David is extremely tall for his age and if he continues improving he could easily develop into one of our outstanding sprinters.

Other young athletes who have performed very well during the season are Jim Hudleston, Larry Tapfield, Mike Benney and George

Gunnee.

Inter-club performances this year were considerably better than the previous year, as we were successful in winning the 'D' Grade Inter-club and the Under 15 Years Division 2, and it was sheer bad luck that we did not win the Under 13 Years as Geoff Bryan, our best sprinter, with the 220 Yards won, fell a few yards from the tape, which lost the Match and the Premiership.

'A' Grade again failed after a most promising start when the Premiers, Western Suburbs, only beat us by one point. This decision could easily have been reversed if just a few more of our athletes had appeared.

We have a most promising Sub-Juvenile in Chris Hunter running in the Under 13 Division. He is the Club Champion for 440 Yards, 880 Yards and 1 Mile and he finished second in the State Half Mile, 2 mins. 25.4 secs. Other good athletes in this Division are Stephen

Keegan, Kevin Warrington and Peter Walters.

St. George, by their performance in the 10,000 Metres State Cross Country Championship, when they won the teams' title with 44 points from Western Suburbs, 63 points, established themselves as the best distance team in the State. The team was Thomas, Rooke, Nodwell, Gribble, Taylor and Burnett. In the 10 Miles and 15 Miles we finished third in the teams' events and on both occasions many of our best athletes were absent.

In the State Marathon we finished fourth in the teams' race, Ron Gribble being our first man to finish in tenth place in 2 hrs. 47 mins.

29 secs.

Popular Johnny Nodwell won the State Novice Cross Country Championship in the good time of 26 mins, 51 secs, and for the second year in succession St. George won the teams' race with 27 points, the team being John Nodwell, Jack Burnett, John Hancock and Bob

The St. George distance team is going from strength to strength and it would not surprise if during the next season we eclipse last

year's performances.

A most gratifying feature of the year has been our increase in membership from 150 to 212 and the membership is made up as follows:

be given.

In the last Annual Report I mentioned that Denis Wilson, although only recently elected to the position of General Secretary, was already doing an excellent job and since then he has confirmed what I first thought and the work he has done during the past 12 months has been really magnificent and the Club has been placed on an excellent footing, a noticeable feature during the year being the increased membership from 150 to 212. My very sincere congratulations to you, Denis, and with this I must also couple Dennis Jolliffe, who has also done a very fine job as Treasurer.

OBITUARY

Since our last Annual Meeting two of our most prominent officials, Mr. James J. Walsh (Patron) and Mr. Ted Ellis (Senior Vice-President) have passed away and we pay tribute to them.

A TRIBUTE TO THE LATE MR. JIM WALSH

The passing of Jim Walsh on 22nd June, 1964, brought to a close a career in athletics which commenced when he joined the Botany Harriers in 1912. Since 1912 Jim Walsh had a most varied career in athletics and he had the respect of all those athletes and officials who associated with him until his sad death.

During his lifetime he carried out many official duties, he was Secretary of Botany Harriers for seven years and also a Life Member. He was Secretary of the N.S.W. Amateur Athletic Association from 1916 to 1919 and for some years he was a Vice-President of the Association. He managed the N.S.W. team at the Australasian Championships at Hobart in 1922 and for six years he was Secretary of the Union of Old Athletes.

Jim's association with the St. George District Amateur Athletic Club commenced in 1922 when our Club used to hold monthly meetings at his premises in Forest Road, Hurstville. At the 9th Annual Meeting of our Club on 17th March, 1930, he was elected Patron and he held

this exalted position until his death.

Also during his athletic career he was a prominent athlete and his best performances were winning the Metropolitan Championships in 1916 and 1917 over 440 Yards and 880 Yards and these Championships were virtually State Championships as these events were abandoned during World War 1.

At all times Jim was prepared to assist members of our Club and he is a figure who will be sadly missed and to his widow and family

we extend our deepest sympathy.

A TRIBUTE TO THE LATE TED ELLIS

When Ted Ellis passed away on 25th May,, 1964, our Club lost one of its dearest and most loyal friends.

Ted Ellis joined our Club in the track season of 1930 and during

known and respected, especially in the Arncliffe/Rockdale area.

In recent years Ted, with some of his old colleagues of the Club, re-established the old members to great effect and on many occasions the old timers, together with a goodly number of present members, had wonderful social functions together. One of the outstanding efforts of Ted less than two years ago was the arranging of two functions with Ted less than two years ago was the arranging of two functions with the Beverly Hills Bowling Club from which our Club received £300. Apart from Ted's great work in helping the Club, he was probably

the most generous donor ever associated with the Club which I can remember. Just one year ago members paid their appreciation to him when they elected him as one of our three Senior Vice-Presidents, and this tribute closes with our deepest sympathy to his wife Bonnie and son Gordon.

Cossart, 8.16.3 in the 1 Mile Walk; L. Tapfield, 27.9 in the 220 Yards Hurdles; and J. Nobbs, 116 ft. 8½ ins. in the Javelin. J. Hudleston, G. Lloyd, I. Ison, I Coyle, P. Levy, W. Jordan, A. Staples, J. Williams and B. Arch also scored points in this grade.

Under 15, Division II.

The under 15 team won the Inter-club Premiership on the last day of the finals, after trailing 60-72. It was the team spirit of the boys which enabled them to win by the narrow margin of four points, and had not each boy done what was asked of him, the team would have been beaten. On the last day we only won three of the seven events contested, excluding the Relay, but depth in all events enabled up to bridge the gap.

Perhaps the most outstanding athlete was D. Stephenson, who, whilst only 13 years old, recorded 10.6 in the 100 Yards, 24.1 in the 220 Yards and 14.8 in the 120 Yards Low Hurdles. L. Gibson was the most prolific points scorer in this grade with performences of 16 ft. 0 ins. in the Long Jump, 13.2 in the 90 Yards Hurdles, 41 ft. 0 ins. in the Shot Put and 82 ft. 2 ins. in the Discus Throw. He also competed in the 100, 220, 440, High Jump, Triple Jump and 120 Yards Low Hurdles, and scored over 200 points for his club. A. Hilton had excellent performances of 2.13.3 in the 880 Yards and 4.58.9 in the 1 Mile. Another athlete who did not start until the season was well

advanced was S. Crozier, who ran 58.5 for the 440 Yards, jumped 4 ft. 9 ins. in the High Jump, and indicated natural ability in other events. N. Lynch jumped 36 ft. 4½ ins. in the Triple Jump, and H. Geof has been a keen athlete throughout the season and has competed regularly in every event with the exception of the 880 Yards and the 1 Mile. He has had performances of 12.0 for 100 Yards, 29 ft. 434 ins. in the Shot Put, 4 ft. 4 ins. in the High Jump and 15 ft. 9 ins. in the Long Jump. P. Walters also competed regularly in these events and when Geof fell in the 220 Yards in the finals, ran through strongly to record 27.4, the fastest time by a St. George athlete in this division. S. These records were the oldest running records with the Club and

I pass to Albert my sincere congratulations for his very fine runs.

My Australian and State records were established at University

Oval on 4th September, 1928, and for the sake of the record it was not

until 2nd August, 1947, that Don Campbell broke my 10,000 Metres Australian time by running 32.39.8 in his attempt on my 10 Mile time and Dave Power beat my State 7, 8, 9 and 10 Mile times when he ran the 10 Mile in 50.21 on 26/8/56 at the E. S. Marks Ground.

Our thanks go to the St. George Rugby Union Football Club for the use of their premises for Club meetings.

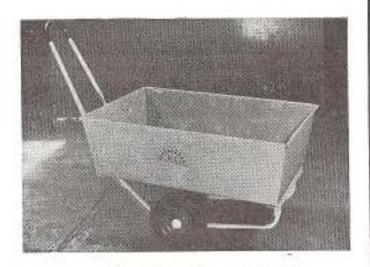
The production of our constitution has been possible due to the efforts of Messrs. Carruthers, Gosling and Fibbins. Copies of the constitution are available on application to the Secretary.

Mr. Doug McBain was appointed as assistant manager-coach of the State team to the Australian Championships.





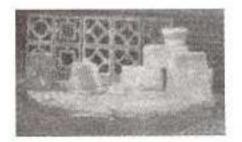

REPORT FROM U.S.A.

Our four members at Oklahoma City University (Greg Glynn, Ian Sharpe, Jeff Duxbury, David Chisholm) correspond regularly with some of our members, but this report is included to give Club members in general the "latest".

Greg has been throwing over 200ft. in training but at this stage has not had very much competition. Jeff writes "We had a most successful cross-country and won nine out of nine meets. We won our State championship and went to the nationals in Michigan and Chicago. Our track season has officially been going for about five weeks now and already Dave, Ian and I have chalked out some good performances. I have run a 1.52.3 to date, a 50.8 and have run about three races over a mile in 4.16.0, and also met Ron Clarke at the Mason-Dixon Games (Indoors—Boards) at Louisville, Kentucky. I ran fifth in the mile in 4.16.0. Have won most of my races in Freshman Division. Dave has run a 4.14 mile to date; a 1.57.5 880; and 9.24 2-mile. Dave has been working on speed work lately in an effort to be able to kick at the end of a race."

Ian writes: "My best broad jump so far is only 23ft. 2in., but in four out of six meets have exceeded 23ft. It appears that I will return to Australia as a 440 runner as I have already run 51.1s. and am hopeful of getting under 50s. in the next couple of weeks."

WALKING

The Club's walking for some years has been extremely weak, but last year it received a boost when Brian McMorrine joined the Club. Unfortunately for Brian and the Club, illness over the last year has seriously interferred with his walking, but we hope he will be back to his old form during the coming winter season.

David Cossart, who has developed into a very capable young walker, was selected to compete in the Under 16 Years Jubilee Shield Interstate Schoolboy Walking Championships held on 23rd May, 1964, in Victoria. Although David was disqualified, I am sure he benefited from the experience and we can expect him to continue to improve during his time in Victoria at the Army Apprenticeship School.

Les Haward, a very experienced walker who is willing to coach any aspiring walkers, will be competing in the Walkers' Club winter season.

SCARBOROUGH PARK NATIONAL FITNESS ASSOCIATION

For many years now we have been affiliated with the Scarborough Park National Fitness Association and have used their hall as our cross country season headquarters. The existing hall will shortly be replaced by a much larger structure which will provide better toilet and dressing room accommodation as well as meeting rooms. It is understood that gymnasium equipment will be available.

Rockdale Municipal Council is financing the building programme, but some £2,000 has to be found by the National Fitness Association which will be relying to a large extent on the support of the affiliated organisations, viz., St. George D.A.A.C., Ramsgate United Football Club and Scarborough Social Club. Your President and Secretary are organising the Building Fund Appeal and all members are asked to support them.

ST. GEORGE LADIES' CLUB

We thank the officials of the Ladies' Club for their assistance in running the Tuesday night competitions at Hurstville Oval. On the occasions of our Schooboys' Championships, the ladies have always lent a much appreciated hand.

The two Clubs have combined in the coaching and social fields to their mutual benefit and we trust this will continue during the next year.
