54TH ANNUAL REPORT AND BALANCE SHEET

PRESENTED TO MEMBERS AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

HELD AT ELECTRICITY HOUSE, HURSTVILLE ON FRIDAY, 16TH MAY, 1975 AT 7.45 P.M.

Gentlemen.

The 54th Annual Report and Balance Sheet is presented to you tonight and results will show that we improved quite substantially on last years performances, particularly during the Track Season.

Easily the outstanding performances of the year were those by Stephen Gee, who retained his Australian Title over 400 metres in 46.4s, and during these Adelaide Championships he was a Member of the N.S.W. 4 x 400 metres Relay, and running the final Leg he ran some metres faster than his Australian resident record of 45.7s.

Stephen during the Season won the State 400 M title in 46.1s - State Resident record, the Victorian title in 45.7s - Australian Resident record.

Stephen has maintained his keen interest in Club affairs, and he again won the 100, 200 and 400M Club Championships. He also scored the magnificent total of 186 points during Interclub, which would be the most points of any athlete in the competition.

Sub Junior Bill Bird, by his performances in the Australian Junior Championships is one of the most promising young athletes in Australia. Competing against athletes nearly 2 years older he gained 3rd place in both the 110M Hurdles 14.6s and 400M Hurdles 54.6s. Young Bill has had a magnificent Season, Club, Interclub and State. Ron Lunt, the State's most consistent Discus and Shot performer did not show his best form in the Australian Championships, where he has gained many places over the years.

Graeme Rootham again had an unfortunate Season. He was regaining good form with a win the Queensland Brisbane match over 800M in 1m 50.7s, when he again developed leg trouble.

The veteran Albert Thomas is running magnificently for his age and is still our best athlete over 5000 and 10000 metres.

Club membership has remained steady at 199 as against 200 the previous year. It is most encouraging to note the increase in Senior athletes from 76 to 96, but the decrease in our younger Age groups from 105 to 88 is something that needs attention and presently it would appear that the flow on from Little Athletics is not as effective as we thought it would be.

Stephen Gee has been judged our best Senior for the 1st time when he was awarded the Hurstville Council Trophy. It would seem that Stephen has every chance of winning this Trophy for years the same as Albert Thomas and Graeme Rootham. Stephen's performances were as follows:

For the 3rd year in succession St. George distance teams failed to live up to their reputation as the strongest Club in the State. St. George, however can claim we are becoming invincible in the Marathon and as this is the Blue Ribbon event at the Olympic Games it is quite an achievement. We gained two representatives in the Australian Marathon at Adelaide, namely: Dave Edwards and Julian Scott, with Dave gaining 14th place in his best time of 2hrs 28m 58s. Dave Edwards was also a member of the N.S.W. winning team. Julian Scott failed to produce his best form finishing 21st in 2hrs 33m 56s. Our Club did better than last year as we won 3 teams races as compared with the 1973 Season. We won the Teams title for the Marathon and during this event Julian Scott, who ran very well to gain 2nd place, established a Club record at 2hrs 25m 41s.

Stephen Connor ran magnificently to win the 5000 Metres Cross Country State title from Graeme Cook and our lads easily won the Teams event. Our Sub-Juvenile boys headed by Clayton Wetherall 6th, won the Teams event. The best individual performances of the year would have been those of Stephen Connor in winning the 5000M Cross Country title and Julian Scott 2nd in the State Marathon.

The St. George Senior athletes, apart from the Marathon competitors are somewhat inclined to treat the State Teams events with indifference, and this is something that needs to be corrected, as it is by entering full teams that wins these teams events.

The Track Season that has just completed was the best we have experienced for years, and all athletes from "A" Grade to Under 13 are to be congratulated for their keeness, which brought about excellent performances in all grades.

The "A" Grade with just a little luck could easily have finished 3rd as they were able to run the Premiers Randwick/Botany Club to a very close match while they beat the runners up Sutherland in the 2nd series. "C", "E" Grades and the Under 15 lads are to be congratulated on winning their Grades. In our Grade teams we look forward to even better results next year with such athletes as Gee, Lunt, Arapovic, Bird, Gilliver, Rootham, Thomas, Derry, Van de Koi, Watson, Magassy, Bowers, Squirrell and a host of other young athletes. The Age group boys had an excellent Season winning the Under 15 Premiership and Runners up in the Under 14 years and Under 13 years. There are many fine young athletes coming along in the Age groups, including Greg Nixon, Harris brothers, Mark Dorrity, Murray West, Martin Spratt, Brad Noyes, Scott brothers, Donald Latham, John Powderly, Robert Bennett and David Fleming and congratulations to Greg Nixon in winning the State Triple Jump and to Mark Dorrity for winning the State Long Jump.

The State Championships brought only 2 victories to St. George when Stephen Gee won the 400M and Ron Lunt the Discus. Dragon Arapovic appeared to have the Pole Vault won, but injured his leg prior to the event. Bill Bird's outstanding achievements in the State Hurdles are recorded elsewhere in this Report. Bill Gilliver one of our most promising young athletes won the State Novice Championship for the Long Jump and with Graeme Cook and Bill Bird he had the honour of representing the N.S.W. Combined Schools in the N.Z. Games at Christchurch.

Once again we thank John and Elaine Bowers for their magnificent contribution to Club funds from the proceeds of their Refreshment Stall that they conducted throughout the year. We also thank their helpers. Ron Gribble again did a wonderful job with his "200" Club from which the Club benefited \$787.

Winter Athletics at Scarborough Park is maintaining its remarkable popularity thanks to the untiring efforts of our Vice President and Organiser New McGuckin. Daylight Saving at Hurstville Oval is still proving very popular and we take this opportunity of thanking the Curator and his Staff for providing such excellent tracks.

Congratulations to Revesby De la Salle School for winning the L.B. Williams and A.A. Gainsford Shields. Last years winners, Marist Bros. Kogarah, were Runners up. Fifteen records were broken including one in the primary division and 14 in the Secondary section.

The St. George Schoolboy's Cross Country Championships held at Scarborough Park on Sunday, 28th April, 1974, were again most successful. Club members did very well by winning 6 of the 9 Events contested. Narwee School won the Denis Wilson Trophy and De la Salle won the L.L. Bosman Trophy.

Club Funds stand at \$4,249.57, which is the second highest in the Club's history and again Dennis Jolliffe is to be congratulated on another very good job.

Our Executive, Officials, Winter and Summer, have again done excellent work and with these outstanding men we can only look forward to another good year.

1974 Distance Season Review

1974 was rather a mixed season, with generally performances below the usual St. George standard.

To take the races in chronological order.

N.S.W. Novice Championship

The team finished 3rd behind Rand-Botany and Sutherland.
M. Donnelly in 2nd place and G. Cook in 4th place ran great individual races.

Newcastle Marathon May 25

Dave Edwards ran a great race in winning this event in the good time of 2hrs 30mins 2secs. Ron Gribble in 3rd place with 2hrs 36mins 20secs completed a successful day for St. George.

N.S.W. Schoolboys Cross-Country Championships

In the open 5k event G. Cook easily won in the time of 16mins 31secs.

The U/17 4k event was won by S. Poulton from Sutherland with S. Connor taking 2nd place.

N.S.W. 15k Cross-Country - Gosford

This race was probably the low point of the season with the St. George team failing to make any showing. With over half of the regular 'A' team members not wishing to compete this was not surprising. R. Squirrell 9th and J. Bowers 19th were the only members who performed well.

N.S.W. Cross-Country Championships

Senior 10K. The team finished in 3rd place behind Sutherland and Rand-Botany. A. Thomas 8th and J. Scott 10th were the only members inside the first 20.

Junior 5K. In this event S. Connor ran the race of his life to take out the championship from the more fancied G. Cook 2nd and P. Hutton 3rd (Suth). M. Donnelly 4th and B. McGuckin 10th ensured a St. George teams victory. As a result of this race S. Connor, G. Cook and M. Donnelly were all selected to represent N.S.W. in the national cross-country titles at Perth.

Juvenile 3K. The team finished 3rd with 58 points, behind Rand-Botany 26 points and Sutherland 45 points. The St. George team being G. Hatsidimitris 11th. R. Abberton 13th. C. Anderson 16th and G. King 18th.

Sub Juvenile 2K. Another good teams win for St. George. C. Wetherall 6th. D. Latham 9th. J. Tunks 11th and M. Legge 13th.

N.S.W. Marathon July 13th

St. George regained the teams championship by defeating Ryde-Hornsby 2nd and Randwick-Botany 3rd. J. Scott ran a great race to finish 2nd to John Farrington and in doing so broke the club record which was held by Ron Gribble. His time was 2hrs 25mins 41secs. Dave Edwards 4th in 2hrs 29mins 15secs and Ron Gribble 9th 2hrs 41mins 04Secs made the scoring team. Others to finish the distance were J. Bowers and young Robert Cook who recorded 2hrs 48mins 46Secs in his marathon debut.

N.S.W. Road Relay

Again St. George didn't show up too well. The Senior 4 x 10k team of J. Bowers, R. Gribble, D. Edwards and R. Cook finished 4th.

In the Junior 4 x 5k we finished 2nd to Sutherland. S. Connor, G. Cook, M. Donnelly and B. McGuckin were the team. G. Cook ran the fastest leg of the day when recording 15 mins 58secs.

The Juvenile 4 \times 1.5k finished 3rd only 1 minute behind the winners Randwick-Botany. The team being R. Abberton, G. Hatsidimitris, A. Gardiner and S. King.

The Sub-Juvenile team of J. Tunks, D. Latham, R. Legge and P. McGuckin did better in finishing in 2nd place to South Coast Branch. Losing by only 2secs.

N.S.W. 25K 31St August

In finishing 6th in the teams title St. George had nothing to talk about.

J. Bowers 8th and R. Gribble 12th were the best of the St. George runners.

AUSTRALIAN MARATHON CHAMPIONSHIP - ADELAIDE

As a result of the N.S.W. Marathon, D. Edwards and J. Scott were selected to represent N.S.W. in the National Title Race.

- D. Edwards performed extremely well in gaining 14th place in a personal best time of 2hrs 28mins 58secs. Being the 3rd New South Welshman to finish thus N.S.W. won the teams title from Victoria and South Australia.
- J. Scott was not able to produce his earlier form and finished 21st in 2hrs 33mins 56secs.

Running as individuals were R. Gribble 19th, 2hrs 33mins 33secs and J. Bowers 23rd, 2hrs 36mins 31secs.

To sum up, a reasonable season from most angles, with not enough emphasis on bringing about a solid team effort, which is necessary to win team titles. The exceptions being the performances of our Junior athletes and the good effort in the N.S.W. Marathon by the Seniors.

SENIOR INTER-CLUB COMPETITION 1974-75 HENSLEY ATHLETIC FIELD

This season has been the best the club has recorded for many years. We entered 5 teams, being represented in A, C, E, F and G Grades, with the honours going to C and E Grade which won their respective competitions.

Our overall performance in all Grades was excellent with many fine achievements by our athletes during the season, some of them being of outstanding merit, such as Stephen Gee's 400 Metres runs, Bill Bird's Hurdling and Graheme Cook's Middle Distance events. We had many young athletes competing regularly, the large majority showing plenty of promise and they fitted in remarkably well with the older men.

Our sprinters improved on the past few years, gaining major points on most occasions, as did our jumpers and hurdlers, but we probably slipped back slightly in our distance events, mostly A Grade, as a few of our distance men are ageing somewhat.

But we can look forward to next season with great confidence because of the many young fellows with outstanding talents coming up from the lower grades.

A. GRADE Our top grade performed admirably, finishing a close fifth, to be just tipped out of fourth place by Western Suburbs in the last match of the season.

We had seven wins and six losses, and the fact of losing our first three matches made it tough going for the remainder of the competition. This grade was a little unlucky to lose to Northern Suburbs and Randwick/Botany in the first two matches.

Randwick/Botany, the premiers, would have been defeated only for the fact that Victorian, Greg Lewis, had his first run that day for Randwick/Botany against St. George. St. George also defeated Sutherland in the second series during the middle of the competition.

Stephen Gee was the outstanding athlete of the Club and probably of the Inter-Club competition, being unbeaten in the 400 Metres, having 9 wins out of 13 in the Sprints with a 10.6s in the 100 Metres on one occasion and 4 wins out of 5 in the 400 Metres Hurdles. Stephen's times for the 400 Metres were 48.7s; 47.3s; 47.9s; 47.6s; 47.3s; 47.0s and 47.1s, which would be the greatest ever seen over this distance at Inter-Club. The 400 Metres Hurdles times were 55.3s; 55.8s; 55.1s; 52.8s; 53.4s and was ably backed-up by Sub-Junior Bill Bird, who also Hurdled brilliantly in the A Grade 400 Metres, his times being 56.8s; 58.9s; 56.6s; 55.8s; 57.5s; 55.4s the last being his personal best.

Our relay team of Stephen Gee, Bill Bird, Bill Gilliver, Lindsay Gee and Barry Isherwood had 8 wins out of 13, which was a tremendous improvement over recent years.

In the Sprints Stephen Gee was ably supported by Lindsay Gee, Barry Isherwood, Bill Gilliver and Arthur Peek. In the Long and Triple Jumps Bill Gilliver held the fort for St. George with some excellent jumps, especially with the wind.

Our High Jumpers, Andrew Taylor, Jim Stammers and Laurie Allison performed well on most occasions gaining valuable points. In the Shot Put and Discus Ron Lunt was again undefeated during the competition with best throws of 15.30m in the Shot and 47.18m in the Discus. During the latter end of the season Ron was joined by a newcomer to the Club, Ron Van De Koi, who showed a lot of promise. The lack of a Hammer and Javelin thrower, particularly early in the season, would have cost us 3 wins in the first series, which might have put the Club in the final, as we went well late in the season with Albert Magassy, Bob Watson and Ron Van De Koi.

In the Distance events we were a little inconsistent compared to other years. The Club sadly missed Graeme Rootham who was out with injury for half of the Season as was Ray Meagher, who came down with serious illness after only four Inter-Club days. But Grahame Cook came into A Grade and ran some magnificent races in both the 800 and 1500 metres, breaking the Club's Junior 800 metre record in the second series match against Sutherland with 1m54.6s. Also Noel Derry had some excellent 800 metres runs, but his 1500 metres was not up to his former best.

The 5000 metres was one of our weakest events and we only scored major points on two occasions, owing somewhat to our athletes in this event not being regular attenders, and some regulars getting a little older, and others being out of form. Alby Thomas had some fine runs, as did Bob Squirrell, Dave Edwards, John Bowers and Julian Scott. During the Season Bob Squirrell had a personal best of 15m7.5s.

Our 3000 metre Steeple chasers of John Bowers and Michael Donnelly had some good wins, particularly earlier in the Season and gained major points in this event. In the Pole Vault Dragon Arapovic again showed that he is one of the best in the State and was only defeated on one occasion. He was ably supported by Bob Watson and Kevin Taylor.

C. GRADE This Grade performed magnificently during the Season, with all athletes performing consistently; only having two losses and a draw. They had a great tussle with Easts in the final, leading at the end of the first day by 18 points. But Easts fought back in the second series, and the competition hinged on the 5000 metres and the Long Jump. At this stage St. George only led by 2 points. John Bowers and Noel Derry teamed like champions to shut out Easts runner Mahony, who looked very dangerous in the final 3 laps, to get 1st and 2nd with Ron Gribble running a creditable 4th. This gave us a lead of 13 points, but the Long Jump was going against us. Bill Bird put in his personal best on his last jump (6.64m) to gain 2nd place, and Dave Bennett, after fouling twice had the pressure on him. He recorded a jump of 6.20m to gain 4th place. We then had an unbeatable lead of 9 points, with only the Relay to come, which Easts won. St. George had a narrow win of 164 to 160, to clinch the Final.

The overall standard was high and attendance every week was regular, and together with the co-operation between athletes - of high order - went a long way towards winning the Championship. Our Sprinters, Bill Bird, Richard Urquhart, Bill Gilliver and Roy Salaski had a good share of wins, and with our Walkers Jim Stammers, Peter Barnes and Tony Nunn, started us off to plenty of good starts. Jim Stammer's walking improved during the Season and was approaching A Grade standard. The 400 metres was handled by Noel Derry and Bill Bird, who ran some very good times, and were capably assisted by Col Richardson.

In the middle distance events we had quite a large number of competitors during the Season, with the competition being very keen, and athletes had to run good times to stay in this Grade. Our 800 metres men were Pat Browne, Geoff Hingerty, Col Richardson and Michael Donnelly, with Ron Gribble coming into the 800 metres Final to take Michael Donnelly's place, after Michael left to go to Melbourne.

In the 1500 metres Ron Gribble, Michael Donnelly and Pat Browne were our top runners for most of the Season, but Alby Thomas, Bob Squirrell and John Bowers forced their way into the Team with some very fine runs towards the end of the Competition. All round, our middle distance men were top class, with some personal best times by the younger men. In the 5000 metres, Michael Donnelly, Ron Gribble, John Bowers and Robert Cook gained major points on every occasion, with Michael Dunning a personal best of 15.50s during the year.

We were very successful in the High Jump with many fine leaps from Laurie Allison, Andrew Taylor, Graham Stitz and Jim Stammers. Some very fine Triple Jumps came to light during the Competition, with Noel Derry and Peter Barnes taking the honours, both jumping their personal bests of 12.71m for Peter and 12.20 for Noel, and they never lost a match once they had come together as a Team. The Long Jumpers, Bill Bird and Dave Bennett also performed well to keep fairly close to the Opposition.

Bill Bird was undefeated in the 110m Hurdles, and gave outstanding displays in this Event with a personal best time of 14.9s, which was a Sub Junior record for the Club. He was ably assisted by Richard Urquhart and Peter Kite.

The 1500 metre Steeple was another event in which the Club shone, gaining top points every time, with the Cook brothers to the fore, plus good efforts by Bob Squirrell and Arthur Peek. Grahame Cook during the Season set a new Club Record for this event of 4m21.8s.

Our Javelin men, Peter McWilliams and Jim Stammers, gave a good account for themselves, with Peter having a personal best of 39.52m towards the end of the Season. These two also starred in the Discus, with Peter having a personal best again of 36.14m. A really great effort here by Jim and Peter, who gained many valuable points in these events.

The Shot Put was capably handled by Mick Benny and Jim Stammers early in the Season; then Albert Magassy and Bob Watson took over later with some successful throws.

Last but not least our Relay team of Richard Urquhart, Peter Kite, Dale Chatwin, Dave Hines, Bill Gilliver, Peter Murphy, Col Richardson and Bill Bird combined well to have many excellent wins.

E GRADE. This Team won the Premiership, being undefeated throughout the Competition, and never looked like being headed at any stage. Many of our younger athletes competed in this Grade and they improved greatly as the Season progressed.

The Sprinters were well represented by Lauri Allison, Peter Kite, Steve Struthers, Stephen Cribb, Dale Chatwin, Richard Urquhart, Peter Murphy and Alan Gardiner, who all ran well.

The middle distance team of John Bowers, Dave Campbell, Pat Browne, Ron Gribble, John Reid and Damien McGuckin were a very formidable side, and only failed on one occasion to gain top points. The times in the 800 metres events were of a very high standard, with John Bowers running twice around the 2mO2s mark, Damien McGuckin having a personal best time of 2mO1.4s and Ron Gribble having a 2mO3s. A new event was added to this Grade, namely a 3000 metre, in which we were very successful, having an unbeaten record with major points every Saturday. It was in this event that Grahame Cook broke the Junior Record with a 8m36.6s, and he ran many very good times during the Season. There were many fine runs by Robert Cook, Noel Derry, Pat Browne, Mark Richardson, Ron Gribble, Tom McNamara, Norm Berger, Dave Campbell and Arthur Cook. Robert Cook and Mark Richardson also registered their personal best times of 9m32s respectively.

The High Jumpers were our youngest, with Rod Starr and Peter Barnes showing excellent form to go through the Season undefeated.

In the Long Jump Laurie Allison had many fine wins, and was well supported by Rod Starr, who showed much improvement as the weeks went by. Others to also help to gain points were Jim Stammers and Dave Bennett.

We had many successful leaps in the Triple Jump, and it was very competitive, with Jumpers going up and down between E and F Grades. John Reid, Rod Starr, Noel Derry, Andrew Taylor, Jim Stammers and Dale Chatwin were highly successful, gaining unusually high points, as was the case with all Long Jumpers. Altogether, the Jumping events put us in a class of our own in the Competition.

Rod Starr did a tremendous job also in the 110 metre Hurdles, when he came up from the Under 16 Age Competition. He was supported by Peter Kite, Richard Urquhart and Laurie Allison, all of whom improved considerably during the Season.

Our mainstays in the 400 metres were Damien McGuckin, Richard Urquhart, Col Richardson, Bill Gilliver and Grahame Cook. These lads ran some fast times, with Damien running a 52.2s, Richard 52.9s, Grahame 52.8s and Bill Gilliver 53.6s, being their personal best times.

Mick Benny and Jim Stammers were unbeatable in the Shot Put, and on a couple of occasions John Bowers threw well to help out in this Event.

F GRADE. In this Grade our athletes were a shade unfortunate not to make the Final, as it was very close between a number of Teams. In the last round Match against Bankstown Sports were were defeated by 52 points to 41 points. If we had managed a few more points and lost by 5 points or less, St. George would have made the Final.

The Sprinters in this Grade started off poorly as far as places went, but were a little unlucky to lose in some very close finishes, that went against us early in the Season. Peter Murphy was very consistent, notching up some good wins as the weeks progressed. Many of the young sprinters in Graeme Jakins, Dave Bennetts, Andrew Cowle, Steve Whiteman and Stephen Cribb had some very fine runs to support Peter Murphy.

As usual our 800 metre and 1500 metre runners were to the fore, having an outstanding record, with plenty of 16-3 wins, to annihilate the opposition on every occasion. We fielded large Teams which included Des Allen, Pat Browne, Robert Cook, John Hancock, Col Richardson, Geoff Hingerty, Kevin Taylor, Dave Campbell, Mark Richardson, John Reid, Richard Sharp, Frank Thornton and Bob Squirrell.

We had a number of High Jumpers who gained major points, including Rod Starr, Bill Gilliver, Peter McWilliams, Mick Benny and Peter Barnes. Rod Starr and Peter Barnes had numerous wins in the Triple Jump, with some fine backing from Dale Chatwin and Jim Stammers.

Pat Browne, Richard Urquhart, Andrew Cowle and Stephen Struthers were the mainstay in the 400 metres, gaining many points. The Long Jump was handled in fine fashion by Laurie Allison, Dale Chatwin, Rod Starr and Peter Barnes, who all showed big improvement as the weeks went by. In the Shot Put, Bill Gilliver was our regular thrower, and was assisted by Peter McWilliams, until Bill Bird came to light late in the Season.

G. GRADE This Grade also had a very good Season, making the Final, but were beaten by Sutherland, who were undefeated, by the margin of 90-73.

Generally, the performances of this Team was very good, and our middle distance runners were our main strength, with Damien McGuckin, Kevin Taylor, Norm Berger, Frank Thornton being very strong in the 1500 metres, while in the 800 metres Peter Mannile, Bruce Godfrey, Ian Parker, Richard Urquhart and Jim Stammers aquitted themselves well.

The Sprinters, led by Graeme Jakins and Keith Dowsett, with help from John Wormall, Jim Stammers, Laurie Allison and Bob Nash, did exceptionally well to gain top points regularly.

In the Long Jump we lost only one Match, due to some fine jumping by Peter McWilliams and Jim Stammers, with some assistance from Mick Benny on a copule of occasions.

Laurie Allison and Mick Benny were also a tower of strength in the Triple Jump, with Laurie having a personal best of 12.03m. We had numerous High Jumpers, with Noel Derry shining towards the end of the Competition. Others to jump were Graeme Jakins, Dave Bennett, Peter McWilliams, Bill Gilliver and Peter Barnes, who all pitched in when help was sorely needed.

The 400 metre men had many close tussles with the opposition, and managed to cut even during the competition. Graeme Jakins improved as time progressed and finished No. 1 in this Event, with Peter Mannile, Steve Struthers and Ron Gribble putting up some pretty good efforts also. The Shot Put was in the capable hands of Laurie Allison, Peter Barnes, John Bowers, Bill Gilliver and Peter Kit, They managed to score well above average.
