



## 58th ANNUAL REPORT & BALANCE SHEET PRESENTED TO MEMBERS AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD AT ELECTRICITY HOUSE, HURSTVILLE ON FRIDAY, 25th MAY 1979 AT 7.45 PM

Gentlemen,

The 58th Annual Report and Balance Sheet is presented to you tonight and results will show that our performances for the past 12 months were well below the very high standard we attained the previous year.

It was during the Track Season that our results were well below recent years performances, brought about for various reasons.

It was unfortunate that we lost a number of our best Senior Athletes together with some of our most promising Young Athletes.

The loss of these Athletes also the late start by some of our best athletes were the main reasons for our below standard Track Season.

While we did not do as well in the Australian Championships at Perth this year as the previous year, nevertheless Vin Plant just failed to retain his 110 metres Hurdles Title while Gary Cox missed out by losing his 400 metres Hurdles Title to finish in 4th place. Andrew Scott Junior finished 8th in the Discus.

Vin Plant was again our outstanding Senior Athlete and probably his best performance was his win in the match Australia versus New Zealand when he won the 110 metres Hurdles from Max Binnington who a little earlier had won the Australian Title. Congratulations to Vin on his winning the Alleyn Gainsford Trophy for the third time in succession as the best Senior Athlete in our Club.

St. George did not perform as well in the State Track Titles as last year, but it was most pleasing to see Vin Plant and Gary Cox retain their 110m and 400m Hurdles respectively. It is hard to believe that Stephen Gee, John Bowers and Ian Ison were able to compete in State Novice Championships but they did and they won the 100m in 10.51; Steeplechase 3000m 9.45.6 and the Hammer 42.94m respectively.

In the Juvenile State, Dean Kimpton won the Triple Jump 12.22 and Darren Scott won the Javelin with a Club Record throw of 42.94m.

In the State Age Championships, Timothy Sparkes, Under 13 Years, won both 100m in 12.4 and 200m in 25.3, both Club Records. While Robert Fong in the same age group took out the Discus at 30.16m.

Our Senior Relay was not as strong as the previous year, nevertheless, they were able to win the 4 x 100 in 41.9 with Gary Cox, John Van Stappen, Vin Plant and Michael Van der Velde. I congratulated all our State Champions on their performances and I am optimistic enough to think that next Track Season we will have more Champions than the season just closed.

Our Interclub performance this year was one of worst on record and the seasons are explained in Peter Phillips Interclub Report. Next season we can only improve on last year's poor effort and again I believe that this can be done.

Jubilee Oval Kogarah. Last Track Season we transferred from Hurstville Oval after 57 years to Jubilee Oval and while the ground had some good features nevertheless we were confronted with difficulties which we hope will be overcome next season.

The ground is larger than Hurstville Oval, with 4 foot lanes and quite a good jumping pit. Storage is good, and there is a restricted area for field events. The ground however is very slow, with the grass left long and it is obvious already that times will be slow and records will not be established.

The season at the ground was also interrupted by changing of nights and towards the end of the year our numbers dropped. It is to be hoped that Kogarah Council will rectify some above difficulties next season.

St. George Distance Athletes again had a great season and for the second year in succession they won the Winter Premiership as follows:-

1. St George (67 points)

2. Western Suburbs (37 points)

3. Sutherland (22 points)

In conjunction with the State Championships the Runner of the Year was decided, which resulted in Dave McInnes, St. George, gaining 2nd place. Dave would certainly have won the title as he missed competing in several Championship Events. St. George gained 4 places in the first 12 which was very good.

Our teams again had splendid victories in the Marathon, Novice CCC, 15km CCC and 2nd places in the 25km Road, 12km CCC, Junior 8 K, and Road Relays.

Dave McInnes had a fine victory in the Marathon and St. George easily won the Teams Event where we remain supreme with 8 Team wins in the past 9 years. Pat Mahoney was a surprise win in the Novice CCC while Laurie Whitty won the Junior 8km for the 3rd time in succession, a great performance. Reference to Dave Edwards fine Winter Season Report gives details of our excellent year.

Winter Athletics at Scarborough Park was again most successful and also very popular with athletes and their families. We are indeed most fortunate to have Scarborough Park as our Winter Headquarters.

The depth of our Younger Athletes at present is not quite as strong as the previous year, but we have a good number with excellent promise including Berry, Scotts, Tunks, Jones, Sparkes, Newton, McCourts, Shaw, Snowden, Howden, Borg, Fong, Kimpton, Mirigliani, Breese, Meier, Wood and Mohr. I have only used Surnames on this and I also know I have forgotten some youngsters, for which I am sorry.

Peter Phillips in his excellent Track Reports has covered the season particularly well especially Interclub, State and Australian Championships and Athletes of promise.

The St. George trip to the Tasmanian Championships 3rd, 4th and 5th March was most successful, and particularly was this noticed in the friendship of all our Athletes. Personally I was very proud of our Athletes and I thank Ron Jones and Arthur Peek for their help. Arthur Peek has made a separate Report about this visit to Tasmania.

Club Membership has again decreased from 238 to 231, spread over all age groups. It is gratifying to note that Seniors have increased from 110 to 115 and Juniors from 19 to 22. It is in the lower divisions Under 17 and Under 12 that we lost 14 Members and it is in this area we must build up our numbers.

From the excellent Financial Statement and Balance Sheet prepared by our Treasurer, it is to be noticed that Athletes have benefited considerably for their representation, Interstate etc. I am aware that St. George Club for years past is probably the most generous Club in the Association to its Athletes, therefore we expect all Athletes and their parents whenever possible to support our Club functions.

Clubs Funds stand at \$4473 which is well below last year's funds of \$5850 and quite substantially below the 1976 figure of \$6404.

We thank Ron Gribble again for organising his "200" Club from which we received the handsome sum of \$1134. Thanks again Ron.

Senior Track Athletes are not supporting Kogarah Jubilee Oval as well as they should and I hope that more support will be forthcoming next Track season. We have the sole use of the ground, there is ample space for training and Senior

With the passing of Bill MacKenzie on the 30th September 1978, many Members were saddened, especially the older Members of the Club.



In the individual points table for the "Distance runner of the year" award Dave McInnes finished 2nd overall despite not competing in several of the point score events.



#### **CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS 1978/79**

Club Championships were based simply upon the Athletes individual performances at Interclub as well as the N.S.W. State Championships held 17th, 18th, 24th and 25th February 1979.

An abnormal situation arose in the 110m Hurdles. Here Junior Athlete, Mark Dorrity (now Senior) had been competing over the Senior standard (3' 6") but his time was still faster than any Junior over the lower height required for Juniors. Under the circumstances he still remained Club Champion. Most outstanding performance from these results was that of Stephen Longden-Gee who regained the form he had achieved in 1974 at 21 years of age. He equalled the Club 200m Record of 20.9 seconds when he finished 3rd in the State Championship on 25.2.79. He had set this record in 1974.

In the Junior Discus, Andrew Scott had a great throw of 47.22m during the last Interclub Match on 10.2.79 to again break the old Record set by David Snell on 11.4.77. A further Record was broken by Junior, Mark Jones when he finished 3rd in the State 2000m Steeplechase Championship (6:07.6) on 24.2.79.

### **INTER-CLUB REPORT 1978-79**

Unfortunately this season was one of the club's worst as far as Interclub results are concerned. These results are: A Grade (5th), B (7th), C (5th), D (last), E (6th) and

G (4th); our club did not enter an F Grade team.

These poor results can be attributed to: (1) transfer of at least 6 "A" Grade athletes in early 1978 for various reasons which actually crippled the good which had been built up previously in athletic depth. Thank you boys for your wonderful attendance and congratulations on a fine effort to Stephen who resides at Campbelltown travelling each week to Interclub.

#### "A" Grade

From 14 matches we won 6, finished 5th (26 points) behind premiers Randwick-Botany (42 points). However, the sprinters were brilliant winning 100, 200 and 400m consistently. Captained by Stephen Longden-Gee the team of Michael Van der Velde, John Van Stappen, John Sullivan, Garry Cox, Vin Plant and John Fortescue excelled even when either athlete was absent. Unfortunately Richard Gurr's season was short having one start only then being out injured the rest of the season. The 4 x 100m relay teams were defeated only once but the 4 x 200m relay lacked a complete "A" team most of the time and won only twice.

In middle distance events depth was lacking although those who competed "A" never stopped trying their hearts out. In the 800m there were 2 wins — both by Noel Derry but points were consistenly gained by Jeff Tunks (S-J) and John Fisher. Jim Stammers was a solid points winner in the Javelin having competed 5 times for 3 wins and 2 seconds. Lloyd Mitchelson and Brett Smith competed twice. Andrew Scott competed once in the last match and both he (46.48m) and Stammers (46.60m) qualified "A" which is bright news for next season. Andrew Scott and Lloyd Mitchelson were excellent point scorers in the hammer. Andrew gained points in 5 matches (2 wins) while Lloyd had 2 wins and 2 seconds from 4 matches; Jim Stammers competed once.

competed once while Paul Curley (1st in 1:59.1) twice and Mark Jones once (1st in 1:59.9). Veteran Ron Gribble was strongest in the 1500m competing 5 times for 2 wins while Robert Squirrell and Richard Sharp each competed 3 times and gaining points. Ray Stephenson (win), John Burchett (win), Paul Curley (win), Jeff Tunks, Brian Doolan (J), Eddie Lynch and Phil Minns (S-J) all started once. The 5000m seen John Burchett, Les Farley, Eddie Lynch and Paul Curley (J) all win while Greg Krahe, Tom Gillis, Alan Staples all gained points.

David Tarbotton handled the 110m hurdles twice for a first and third while Bill Bird started once for a win. Bill was only able to compete in 3 matches. Greg Krahe and John Burchett were the "iron men" of the 200m steeplechase each competing twice and both recording wins. Mark Jones also started once for a second placing.

Frank Mirigliani (S-J) started well in the shot put winning first up (9.28m) but needs more training to develop technique and strength. Peter McWilliams is a great stalwart of Interclubs and he gained a win from two matches while Ian Ison and Lloyd Mitchelson competed once each gaining points.

## "D" Grade

A 4 x 100m relay team was fielded twice succeeding in a win. A shortage of "B", "C" and "D" grade sprinters was very noticeable.

The 800m races seen Mark Dorrity, Brian Doolan, Mark Jones and Peter Phillips all record a win each. Peter Phillips competed in 4 matches and Phil Minns in 3; Stephen Bible, Brian Doolan, Mark Dorrity, Ron Gribble and Laurie Whitty all competed twice while Mark Jones, Andrew Wood, Robert Sweet, Mark Howden and Damien McGuckin started in this grade once only. In all matches points were scored.

Again, in the 1500m we were well represented and Warren McCourt, John Burchett, Brian Doolan, Mark Jones and Robert Squirrell all had a win each. Burchett competed in 3 matches, McCourt and Peter Phillips in 2 while Mark Dorrity, Phil Minns, Doolan, Lloyd Mitchelson, Jones, Squirrell and Andrew Wood started once.

Although not strong in depth for the 3000m in this grade good performances were achieved — Peter Cotton started once for a win (9:09) then was injured; John Fisher once for a win (9:15.7) while Colin Richardson started twice improving tremendously winning one match and also recording a 9:15.8. John Lee and Ron Gribble competed twice but our main stay was the courageous and determined subjunior Warren McCourt who competed in 5 matches gaining valuable points each time.

Only John Burchett and Stephen Molino competed on one occasion each in the 110m hurdles being 3rd and 4th respectively. Richard Morgan and Andrew Wood both won the 2000m steeplechase on the one occasion which each competed while others to start once were Rick Barrett and Neville Markham.

Andrew Scott (J) dominated the shot put competing in 6 matches winning 5 and being placed 2nd in the other — a splendid effort; Brett Smith twice for 2 seconds. In "E" wins came to Aaron Meier, Glen Johnson and Mark Howden while consistent competitors Howden (S-J), Meier (S-J), David Tarbotton (S-J), Craig Sams (S-J), Gordon Schofield and Warren Phillips (S-J) while Glen Johnson, Stephen Molino, Stephen Mohr and Peter McWilliams all had a start in these sprints.

Damien McGuckin, Peter Cotton and Stephen Bible were the 400m stayers with McGuckin winning one match in 55.5 seconds. Brian Doolan (J) and Robert Sweet each raced once for a win each while John Burchett started once.

There was a tremendously large number of starters in middle distance events but again many athletes failed to compete in the latter half of Interclub or the

#### COMMENTS ON ANNUAL FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

by Dennis Jolliffe

One of the main criteria in assessing the financial wealth of the Club is the level of the Club's funds, including the Reserve for Team Expenses. The balance in the Reserve at 31st March 1979 was determined after the amount due for the Travelling Expenses for the Tasmanian trip was transferred to Sundry Creditors to reflect the true position of the Reserve for Team Expenses. Over the last 5 years, the Club's funds have moved as follows:—

Included in the negative movement of \$1,377.32 in Club Funds for 1978-79 was a drop of \$893.06 in the Reserve for Team Expenses. During 1978-79, the Reserve was reduced by the amount which the Club underwrote the cost of the Tasmanian trip, and it was also affected by the fact that no proceeds were received from sale of refreshments. For the third consecutive year, the General Fund has incurred a loss. The Club needs to pay careful attention to its finances, to ensure that wherever possible expenditure on promotions is covered by receipts.

Payments to individuals from the Teams Fund totalled \$1,437.90. Individual Athletes who received assistance were N. Berger, J. Bowers, G. Cox, D. Edwards, T. Gillis, R. Gribble, S. Longden-Gee, V. Plant, A. Scott, K. Taylor, M. Vander Velde, C. Whiteman and L. Whitty.

I wish to thank Ron Gribble and members of the Ladies Auxillary for their Fund Raising efforts. I would also like to thank Peter Phillips, Assistant Treasurer for capably handling Club Funds while I was in Canberra during the year and Mr.

David Carlisle who has kindly agreed to act as Honorary Auditor.
