







Alan Staples and Arthur Peek, Distance and Track Secretaries for Winter and Summer, have prepared excellent reports where all results and details are shown.



class gear is available for all events and the 400 metre and 100 metre tracks are quite good.

The 41st Annual Schools Track and Field Championships were held at our Summer Headquarters, Harold Fraser Oval, Carrs Park and were most successful. Nine records were broken following 16 records of the previous year, which is very encouraging and a compliment to the curator, Stephen Bunting, for preparing such good tracks.

Gymea Bay won the L.B. Williams Shield for Primary Schools and Marist Bros Kogarah were successful in winning the A.A. Gainsford Shield for secondary schools.

The fourth successive St. George trip to the Track and Field Championships, Tasmania was again successful and enjoyable. The team of 17 was small than the previous year, nevertheless we came back with 12 medals.

We have made many friends at Hobart and it is good to know that the Tasmanian A.A.A. and the Hotel wish to have us return in 1983. Arthur Peek as usual was of great assistance to me during the visit and he has made a separate report of the results.

Club membership has decreased from 241 to 195 over all age groups. The main loss in membership is that seniors have decreased from 99 to 78 and Under 15 from 52 to 36. Various reasons have brought about this loss of members but it is understood that other clubs have also had a loss of numbers during the past 12 months. It behoves all members to assist in bringing our membership beyond 200 which our Club feels can be done.

From the excellent Financial Statement and Balance Sheet prepared by our Treasurer, it is noted that athletes have again benefited for representation mainly interstate, therefore, we look forward to members and friends supporting our Club functions whenever possible. The level of Club Funds stand at \$6,648.31 which is most satisfactory. Donors to Club Funds are thanked for their contributions but we must also remember those officials and members who promote and fincially support Club functions throughout the year. A welcome addition to Club funds during the past 12 months was from the following R.S.L. Clubs: Brighton RSL \$500, Penshurst RSL \$100, Bexley RSL \$50, Mortdale RSL \$20. It is intended that we again approach RSL Clubs for financial assistance next year.

Winter athletics at Scarborough Park was again most succesful and also very popular with athletes, their families and friends. We are certainly fortunate to have such good conditions for our Winter Headquarters. Frequently we had over 100 athletes competing and on occasions nearly 150.

Since St. George Club was formed in 1921 we have always enjoyed the reputation of being a good and very happy club and this friendship is still very much in evidence today.

Scarborough Park is a grand place to maintain and make new friends and the visits to Tasmania and country areas have helped the Club and family atmosphere quite considerably. I sincerely welcome the new members who have joined our ranks and I wish them well and every success.

Our most sincere thanks to our ladies' Social Committee who have again done an excellent job during the past 12 months. Club funds have benefited considerably by their efforts and this Committee is headed by Tess Page, President; Jean Gribble, Secretary and Cheryl Bray, Treasurer.

We welcome new members Pat Donnelly, Kerry Edwards, Kath Delamare and Judy Webb.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT 1981-82 Summer Season

A very busy summer season has just drawn to a close and many of our athletes can be proud of their achievements in the past six months. The Club is proud to have two Australian champions as members: Robert Henderson - All Schools U/19 200m, Australian U/20 100m and James Neale - All Schools U/17 discus. These two fine athletes will be the ones to watch in future years. Our efforts at interclub were an improvement over the past few years - with many of our athletes bettering their previous best performance. Our visits to country and interstate carnivals this season again was most successful and the momentum is still building. It appears that next season we will have more Club members wishing to participate on trips away. Already we have some thirtyfive for the Cowra Easter Games.

The Senior Men's Interclub Competition held at Sydney Athletic Field and Hensley Field during the summer resulted in victory for our "E" and "F" Grades. "C" Grade was beaten by a countback in points for and against as a tie-breaker. "A" Grade finished in sixth place after some excellent results during the season. "B" Grade finished a close fourth and "D" Grade finished a close second in the competition. This year it was a combined effort by St. George and Banstown Sports athletes in the senior grades. The Executives of both clubs and the A.A.A. of N.S.W. all agreed upon the combination for senior grade competition. It can be seen by the results that the joint effort was most successful. It was encouraging to see the management of both clubs, team officials and participating athletes get on so well together and it appears that the joint combination may be in force for next summer season.

The Southern Zone Interclub Competition was again held at Sylvania Waters on a Friday night. Our Club was represented in the Under 13, Under 14 and Under 15 age groups for both boys and girls. Invitation competition was held for senior athletes as most club athletes were required for Senior Interclub. It appears that the Under 14 boys team was successful in the premiership this season against the other clubs making up the zone, Sutherland, Bankstown Sports and Revesby Workers. Our numbers of competing athletes were down on last year's figures: U/13, 11 athletes — 26 last year; U/14, 11 — 12 last year; U/15, 6 — 11 last year.

I had pleasure in attending the Stewart Toyota — leader Sportstar of the Year — Presentations on 10th March, 1982. It was an impressive occasion for our Club to have so many athletes presented as weekly Sportstar winners. The awards were introduced primarily to encourage sportsmen and sportswomen of all age groups to aspire to represent their districts, the State and Australia. The St George and Sutherland Shire have attained some remarkable successes in sport and, combined, would rival any comparable district in Australia. The St. George D.A.A.C. had more representatives at the presentation than any other sporting group. Junior (U/16) stars: Robert Rong, Julie Page, Jamie Neale, Martin Lubrano, Ian Argall, Sue-Ellen Ennever, and the Juvenile Track team who won the John Treloar Trophy from their results in the N.S.W. Relay and Track & Field Championships — Jamie Neale, Robert Fong, Luke Bray, Harry Pavlidis, Ian Argall, Brett Newton and Darren Barkas. Seniors to gain awards include John Andrews, Robert Henderson and John Bowers.

Our visits to interstate and country meetings were again most successful this year as can be seen by the detailed results in the report. We have a fine group of athletes developing in this Club and we must encourage and assist their development as they will be our future top graders. Their efforts in representing the Club, in both track and field competition and their general behaviour have been outstanding and we are fortunate indeed to have so many fine young ambassadors.

Top junior athletes Robert Henderson U/19, Jamie Neale, Harry Pavlidis, Paul Jones U/17 and Roger Summerill U/15 all recorded first class performances in the N.S.W. Schools Championships and went on to compete at the Australian All-Schools Track and Field Championships where again top performances were recorded.

The N.S.W. Relay Championships were a big disappointment this year. Last year we had seven medal winning teams and this year we could only manage two. In the Under 20 age group the $4 \ge 1500$ team finished second to Wests, winning State record time and the $4 \ge 200$ team finished an impressive third in a fierce junior final. Last year's champions in the Under 15 4 \ge 100, 200 and 400 events found the rise in age group to Under 17 a very difficult hurdle and should do much better next season. Many young athletes in the U/15 age group should make it interesting for next season.

Our participation in the Australia Day Relays in Canberra on the 30th January, 1982 was again a tremendous success. The squad returned with 14 team placings against some very competitive interstate opposition. We had four first placed teams, four second placed and six in third place and our overall points finished us in fifth place — one better than last year and with a little more luck we could have finished closer to the winner.

The A.C.T. Track and Field Championships were held at Bruce Stadium, Canberra during late February. St. George athletes returned with 18 medals, six gold, six silver and six bronze from the first days competition. We were unable to compete on the next weekend due to N.S.W. Age Championships and the club trip to Tasmania.

The N.S.W. Novice Championships at Hensley Athletic Field late January saw Andrew Scott placed first in the hammer and Jan McLoughlin placed third in the 800 metres final.

The N.S.W. Track and Field Championships were held in Sydney during mid-February. In the Under 15 age group we had two placed athletes. Martin Lubrano finished second in the 800 metres and Mark Jansen, in his first year of club athletics, finished a gallant second, same time as the winner, 11.7 seconds for the 100 metres. In the Under 17 age group, Jamie Neale was a brilliant performer, dominating the shot put, discus and javelin events. Robert Henderson was also brilliant in his domination of the Under 20 years 100 and 200 metre events.

The N.S.W. Age Championships were held at the Sydney Athletifc Field at the end of February. Here Luke Bray was our sole winner, in the Under 16 long jump. His jump of 6.48 metres is his best performance to date and is an outstanding improvement. We had seven athletes placed during these age championships.

The Club made our fourth visit to the Tasmanian Track and Field Championships held at the Domain Athletic Field, Hobart on February 27, 28 and March 1, 1982. Although only a small team we returned with twelve placings in the championships — 2 firsts, 4 seconds and 6 thirds. Jamie Neale was our only gold medal winner, on this, our fourth successive trip, being placed first in the shot and discus in the Under 17 age group. The visit to Tasmania was again a most successful one. The results are quite satisfying and tour manager Mr Gainsford must be thanked for the effort involved in organising our visits this year.

The Australian Track and Field Championships were held at the Q.E. II Stadium, Mt Gravatt, Brisbane during mid-March and Club athlete Robert Henderson recorded excellent results. He won the Under 20 years 100 metres and finished second in the 200 metres final — recording the same time as the winner.

Congratulations to our State representative athletes: Roger Summerill U/15, James Neale and Con Kotis U/17, Robert Henderson U/20 and Col Whiteman in the seniors.

Many of our Club athletes recorded fine performances during State championships or at interclub competition, resulting in many records being broken again this year. All of these fine performances can be seen in the results of the Club championships based on interclub and Sate championship efforts. To the annual award winners, I extend my congratulations as in many cases it was a very close decision. Ron Gribble recorded an outstanding 4m 09.2 sec to break the Australian Veterans 0.45 1500m record at interclub during March, 1982.

A special word of thanks to our many officials, too many to name, who give their services so as athletes may compete. Our Club coaches and Executive must also be congratulated on their efforts throughout the season as many hours are spent each week in relation to our athletes. This Club has many talented athletes in both track and field competitions, and if this development continues as it has over the past few seasons the St. George Club will have many top athletes competing for many seasons to come.

Once again the Reserve for Team Expenses has diminished, this time from \$632.46 at 31.3.81 to \$262.47 at 31.3.82. However payments to individuals from the Teams Fund totalled \$1,733 and these were financed largely from Fun Run prize money (\$500) (from J. Bowers, J. Fisher, A. Thomas and R. Stephenson) and Social Committee activities which raised \$683.
