TEAMS' RACE TO GOULBURN.

Keep, of St. George Club, won from other runners in the twentieth race for the five miles novice cross-country championship of New South Wales, at Kensington Racecourse, on Satur-day, promoted by the East Sydney Club. Goulwho finished third, also annexe representatives Morgan, also annexed sealed handicap, in which the country runners filled the three places, and the Goulburn men also won the teams' race. Twelve clubs com-

peted.

The runners started from the three furlongs post, and R. T. Dent, G. Keep, R. Batty, and C. A. Jeppesen were the leaders as they passed the stand for the first time. They then completed a circuit of the course proper, and Keep turned into the straight in advance of C. Cooper, Jeppesen, and Batty. Leaving the track, the competitors raced up the hill on the eastern side of the course, and Keep moved away from Cooper. The former increased his advantage as they passed The former increased his advantage as they passed the judge's box, and commenced another lap of the C McIntyre was then in third position, track. followed by Morgan. The leading trio remained unaltered, but Keep moved further away as they ascended the hill for the second time. At Anzacparade, on the western side. Cooper passed Keep, and the former was still in front with a lap to complete the journey. Morgan was third lowed by Dent and McIntyre had fallen Morgan was third. fol-Cooper, Keep, and Morgan into sixth place. had an advantage of 100 yards from the fourth man, and before the straight was reached they had overlapped the field.

Cooper was unfortunate during the concluding ages in the straight. The overlapped runners stages in the straight. were instructed to keep clear of the finishing men, and in endeavouring to pass a Western Suburbs man Cooper collided with him and received a spike injury to his knee. The mishap gave Keep his opportunity, and he crossed the line a couple of vards in advance of Cooper. gave Keep his opportunity, and he crossed the line a couple of yards in advance of Cooper, Morgan finishing close up in third place. Keep's time was 25m 5s, and this was 15 seconds faster than T. E. Ballard's figures of last year. All three placed men showed superior time to the 1931 winner. The winner is 21 years of age, and finished eighth last year.
