Novice Championship.

BOTANY'S DUAL WIN.

W. Hamilton, of the Botany Harriers, won the State novice five miles cross-country championship at Kensington racecourse on Saturday in the record time of 27 minutes. His club tied with the holder—South Sydney—for the teams' supremacy, but owing to having the four men home earlier Botany was awarded first place.

The entry of 74 was 11 in excess of last year's, and 57 runners competed, representing six clubs and five individual athletes. Starting from the judge's box on the course proper, the men ran a furlong on the straight, then retraced their steps. V. Millington, J. Wilson, J. Chalmers, F. Packwood, S. Packwood, and T. Baker headed the field as they rounded the turn. At the completion of the first circuit Baker held a slight advantage from Millington, H. Harrison, D. White, R. Young, and J. Hayes.

When points were counted for the teams' race, it was ascertained that Botany and South Sydney had each scored 31 points. The international rule is that in such a tie the club with the last man of the team in before its opponent is the winner. Botany's fourth man was 12th, and South Sydney's was 13th, thus Botany became the winner.

CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIP COURSE.

Messrs. R. H. Boyan, B. C. Button, and A. J. Hodsdon, who have been appointed to choose the course for the 10,000 metres cross-country championship of New South Wales on July 31, selected the route at Randwick Racecourse yesterday. Although the course will be simplified, it will be more severe than last year. It will include five laps on the flat of the old steeplechase and present magpie tracks, and the athletes will also negotiate fences and brush hurdles. During the second lap the men will ascend the hill on the eastern side, and in the fourth lap they will travel on the old steeplechase hill. The course proper will not be used.

SCHOOLBOYS' COACHING CLASS.

There was an increased attendance at the Western Suburbs club's schoolboys' coaching classes at Concord Oval on Saturday morning, when 70 boys engaged in sectional training in exercises, sprints, and practising the broad jump, high jump, hop, step and jump, and shot putt.
