O. PAWSON CHAMPION.

COMPETITOR'S COLLAPSE.

The State novice five miles crosscountry championship was won by O. Pawsen of South Sydney club, at the Kensington raccourse on Saturday.

Botany for the third consecutive year gained the teams' honours. The senior five miles scratch race was won by E. Evans (St. George), and Botany also appropriated the teams' race.

J. Entwistle, of South Sydney, a former State 860 yards champion and winner of the Braybrook Cup open road race in May at his first effort in long-distance racing, was expected to win the title, but after holding a prominent position for most of the race, coirapsed with three furlongs to go. Pawson, who took the lead a mile from the finish, won by 30 yards from A. Shipp, of Wellongong, with H. Duncan (Botany) in third place.

Pawson is 21 years of age. He made his first appearance last season, and won the Randwick-Kensington open race. On that showing he was expected to win the novice championship that season, but finished ninth. This year he was third in the Randwick-Kensington event. His time was im 3s slower than last year, but the course was slightly altered on Saturday.
